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**AN ORDINANCE AUTHORIZING AND APPROVING A
PAYMENT OF COMPENSATORY TIME TO A FORMER
EMPLOYEE OF THE VILLAGE OF MELROSE PARK, COUNTY
OF COOK, STATE OF ILLINOIS.**

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WHEREAS, the Village of Melrose Park, Cook County, State of Illinois (“the Village”) is a duly organized and existing Village created under the provisions of the laws of the State of Illinois, and is now operating under the provisions of the Illinois Municipal Code, and all laws amendatory thereof and supplementary thereto with full powers to enact ordinances for the benefit of the residents of the Village; and

WHEREAS, the Village President, the Honorable Ronald M. Serpico, the Village Clerk, the Honorable Mary Ann Paolantonio Salemi, having taken office on May 2, 2005 and the Village Board of Trustees, the Honorable John S. Conteduca, Cathleen Cossident Italia, Tom "T.K." Klein, Ruben Lomeli, Trustee Arturo J. Mota and Anthony J. Prignano, having taken office on May 2, 2005, constitute the duly elected, qualified and acting officials of the Village; and

WHEREAS, police records have been provided to the Village indicating that, Vito R. Scavo (hereinafter “Scavo”) has accumulated in excess of four hundred eighty hours (480) of compensatory time (hereinafter the “Comp Time”); and

WHEREAS, pursuant to the Agreement by and between the Village of Melrose Park and the Mickinzie-Virtuno Memorial Fraternal Order of Police Lodge No. 19, no officer shall accumulate more than four hundred eighty (480) hours of compensatory time. Therefore, Scavo is entitled to four hundred eighty (480) hours of compensatory time; and

WHEREAS, Scavo's hourly rate of pay, as of September 15, 2006, was Fifty Two Dollars and 89/100 (\$52.89) per hour; and

WHEREAS, on or about October 05, 2006, the Village issued a payroll draft to Scavo in the amount of four thousand six hundred twenty two dollars and 89/100 (\$4,622.89) (hereinafter the "Draft"). The Draft was issued in error. Accordingly, the amount of four thousand six hundred twenty two dollars and 89/100 (\$4,622.89) shall be deducted from the total amount due and owing to Scavo for Comp Time; and

WHEREAS, Scavo is owed the amount of twenty thousand seven hundred sixty dollars and 71/100 (\$20,760.71) for Comp Time. This amount represents the sum of Scavo's hourly rate multiplied by four hundred eighty hours of Comp Time due and owing less the amount of the Draft issued in error (hereinafter the "Payment"); and

WHEREAS, the Payment will be issued as a payroll draft with customary deductions; and

WHEREAS, the President and the Board of Trustees (the "Village Board") of the Village of Melrose Park, County of Cook, State of Illinois, have heretofore determined and do hereby determine that payment to Scavo for Comp Time is advisable and in the best interest of the Village and its residents; and

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the Village President and the Board of Trustees of the Village of Melrose Park, Cook County, Illinois, as follows:

**ARTICLE I.
IN GENERAL**

Section 01. Incorporation Clause.

The President and Board of Trustees of the Village (the "Village Board") hereby find that all of the recitals hereinbefore stated as contained in the preambles to this Ordinance are full, true and correct and does hereby, by reference, incorporate and make them part of the Ordinance as legislative findings.

Section 02. Purpose.

The purpose of this Ordinance is to authorize and approve a certain payment to Scavo for compensatory time due and owing.

Section 03. Invocation of Authority.

This Ordinance is enacted pursuant to the authority granted to this Village by the Constitution of the State of Illinois and the Illinois Compiled Statutes.

Section 04. State Law Adopted.

All applicable provisions of the Illinois Compiled Statutes, including the Illinois Municipal Code, as may be amended from time to time, relating to the purposes of this Ordinance are hereby incorporated herein by reference.

Sections 05-09. Reserved.

**ARTICLE II.
AUTHORIZATION FOR PAYMENT**

Section 10.00 Approval of Payment.

That Scavo's request for payment of Comp Time is hereby approved and funds are currently available for said payment of Comp Time.

Section 11.00 Approval and Execution of Documents.

That the request for payment of Comp Time is hereby approved, based on the findings enumerated in this Ordinance, with such insertions, omissions and changes as shall be approved by the Village President, Village Attorney or other members of the governing body of the Village executing documents regarding the same; and the Village President is hereby authorized and directed to execute, and the Village Clerk, if necessary, is hereby authorized and directed to attest and countersign any and all documents in connection with the payment and any related exhibits attached thereto, whether or not such documents are attached to this Ordinance, and the Village Clerk, if necessary, is also authorized to affix the seal of the Village to such documents.

Section 12.00 Other Actions Authorized.

The officers, employees and/or agents of the Village shall take all action necessary or reasonably required to carry out, give effect to and consummate the transactions contemplated by this Ordinance and to take all action necessary in conformity therewith, including, without limitation, the execution and delivery of any documents required to be delivered in connection with the payment of Comp Time.

**ARTICLE III.
SAVINGS CLAUSES,
PUBLICATION, EFFECTIVE DATE**

Section 13.00 Headings.

The headings for the articles, sections, paragraphs and sub-paragraphs of this Ordinance are inserted solely for the convenience of reference and form no substantive

part of this Ordinance nor should they be used in any interpretation or construction of any substantive provisions of this Ordinance.

Section 14.00 Severability.

The provisions of this Ordinance are hereby declared to be severable and should any provision, clause, sentence, paragraph, sub-paragraph, section, or part of this Ordinance be determined to be in conflict with any law, statute or regulation by a court of competent jurisdiction, said provision shall be excluded and deemed inoperative, unenforceable, and as though not provided for herein, and all other provisions shall remain unaffected, unimpaired, valid and in full force and effect. It is hereby declared to be the legislative intent of the Board of Trustees that this Ordinance would have been adopted had not such unconstitutional or invalid provision, clause, sentence, paragraph, sub-paragraph, section, or part thereof had not been included.

Section 15.00 Superseder.

All code provisions, ordinances, resolutions and orders, or parts thereof, in conflict herewith, are to the extent of such conflict hereby superseded.

Section 16.00 Publication.

A full, true and complete copy of this Ordinance shall be published in pamphlet form or in a newspaper published and of general circulation within the Village as provided by the Illinois Municipal Code, as amended.

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Section 17.00 Effective date

This Ordinance shall be in full force and effect upon passage and approval, as provided by the Illinois Municipal Code, as amended.




