ORDINANCE NO. 1152

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING CHAPTER 15.16, PLUMBING CODE, OF THE VILLAGE OF MELROSE PARK MUNICIPAL CODE, FOR THE VILLAGE OF MELROSE PARK, COUNTY OF COOK, STATE OF ILLINOIS.

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WHEREAS, the Village of Melrose Park, Cook County, State of Illinois (“the Village”) is a duly organized and existing Village created under the provisions of the laws of the State of Illinois, and is operating under the provisions of the Illinois Municipal Code, and all laws amendatory thereof and supplementary thereto with full powers to enact ordinances for the benefit of the residents of the Village; and

WHEREAS, the Village President (the “President”), the Honorable Ronald M. Serpico, the Village Clerk, the Honorable Mary Ann Paolantonio Salemi, having taken office on May 2, 2005, and the Board of Trustees of the Village (the “Village Board”), the Honorable John S. Conteduca, Cathleen Cossident Italia, Arturo J. Mota, Anthony J. Prignano and Mary Ramirez Taconi, having taken office on May 14, 2007, constitute the duly elected, qualified and acting officials of the Village; and

WHEREAS, from time to time, the City of Chicago, or its designee, publishes the Chicago Plumbing Code, which, among other things, sets standards for the maintenance and installation of plumbing fixtures, equipment and related appurtenances and sets the fees associated therewith; and

WHEREAS, the City of Chicago, or its designee, has published an updated and revised edition of the Chicago Plumbing Code, known as the City of Chicago Plumbing Code, 2007 Edition (the “Chicago Plumbing Code”); and

WHEREAS, the President and Village Board have determined that it is both advisable and in the best interest of the Village to make certain amendments to Chapter 15.16, Plumbing Code, of the Village of Melrose Park Municipal Code, as amended, (the “Village Code”) by adopting the Chicago Plumbing Code; and

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the Village President and the Board of Trustees of the Village of Melrose Park, Cook County Illinois, as follows:

**ARTICLE I.
IN GENERAL**

Section 01. Incorporation Clause.

The President and the Village Board hereby find that all of the recitals hereinbefore stated as contained in the preambles to this Ordinance are full, true and correct and do hereby, by reference, incorporate and make them part of the Ordinance as legislative findings.

Section 02. Purpose.

The purpose of this Ordinance is to amend Chapter 15.16, Plumbing Code, of the Village Code, as amended, by the adopting the Chicago Plumbing Code, to replace prior editions.

Section 03. Invocation of Authority.

This Ordinance is enacted pursuant to the authority granted to this Village by the Constitution of the State of Illinois and the Illinois Compiled Statutes.

Section 04. State Law Adopted.

All applicable provisions of the Illinois Compiled Statutes, including the Illinois Municipal Code, as may be amended from time to time, relating to the purposes of this Ordinance are hereby incorporated herein by reference.

Sections 05-09. Reserved.

**ARTICLE II.
AMENDMENTS TO CHAPTER 15.16, PLUMBING CODE;
ADOPTION OF CHICAGO PLUMBING CODE.**

Section 10.00 Amendment of Section 15.16.010, Adoption of Chicago Plumbing Code.

That Section 15.16.010, Adoption of Chicago Plumbing Code, of the Village Code is hereby deleted in its entirety, notwithstanding anything to the contrary, and replaced with the following language:

That certain document, a copy of which is on file in the Village Clerk's office, being marked and designated as "The City of Chicago Plumbing Code, 2007 Edition," is hereby adopted as the Plumbing Code of the Village and is made a part hereof as if fully set out in this section, with the additions, insertions, deletions, and changes, if any, as prescribed by this Chapter.

Section 10.01 Amendment of Section 15.16.020, Supplements to Chicago Plumbing Code.

That Section 15.16.020, Supplements to Chicago Plumbing Code, of the Village Code is hereby deleted in its entirety, notwithstanding anything to the contrary, and replaced with the following language:

That as a supplement and in addition to the regulations, provisions, penalties, conditions and terms of the City of Chicago Plumbing Code, 2007 Edition, adopted hereinabove by Section 15.16.010, the following additional supplementary regulations, provisions, conditions and terms hereby apply (the "Supplements"):

- A. Single Family Homes, 2-Unit Dwellings and 3-Unit Dwellings.
The Following Plumbing Piping Material is Permitted:

Underground Waste and Vent

1. Cast Iron Soil with lead joints, or rubber gaskets
2. PVC with PVC cement and purple primer

Above Ground Waste and Vent

1. Cast Iron with lead joints
2. Cast Iron "No Hub" with stainless steel clamps
3. PVC with PVC cement and purple primer
4. Galvanized Pipe

5. Copper Type "M"

Above Ground Storm

1. Cast Iron with lead joints
2. Cast Iron "No Hub" with stainless steel clamps
3. Galvanized Pipe
4. PVC with PVC cement and purple primer
5. Copper Type "M"
6. Ductile Iron

Underground Water

1. Ductile Iron Class 52
2. Copper Type "K"

Aboveground Water

1. Galvanized Pipe
2. Copper Type "L"
3. Copper Type "K"

Minimum Size of Underground Waste - Four (4) Inch

Minimum Size of Water Service - One (1) Inch

Sanitary Ejector Basin

1. Cast Iron
2. Fiber Glass

- B. Multiple Unit Dwelling - Having Accommodations for Four (4) or More Dwelling Units, Including Condominiums, Commercial, Light Manufacturing, Industrial and Institutional (Three (3) Stories and Under).
The Following Plumbing Piping Material is Permitted:

Underground Waste and Vent

1. Cast Iron Soil with lead joints *or* rubber gaskets
2. PVC with PVC cement and purple primer

Aboveground Waste and Vent

1. Cast Iron with lead joints
2. Cast Iron "No Hub" with stainless steel clamps
3. PVC with PVC cement and purple primer
4. Galvanized Pipe
5. Copper Type "M"

Above Ground Storm

1. Cast Iron with lead joints
2. Cast Iron "No Hub" with stainless steel clamps

3. Galvanized Pipe
4. PVC with PVC cement and purple primer

1. Ductile Iron Class 52

C. Multiple Unit Dwelling - Having Accommodations for Four (4) or More Dwelling Units, Including Condominiums, Commercial, Light Manufacturing, Industrial and Institutional (Four (4) Stories or More).

The Following Plumbing Piping Material is Permitted:

Underground Waste and Vent

1. Cast Iron Soil with lead joints *or* rubber gasket
2. PVC with PVC cement and purple primer

Aboveground Waste, Stacks and Closet Bends

1. Cast Iron with lead joints (Bathrooms minimum size four (4) inch

Aboveground Vents and Drains Two (2) Inch and Under

1. Cast Iron with lead joints
2. PVC with PVC cement and purple primer
3. Copper Type "M"

Above Ground Storm

1. Cast Iron with lead joints
2. Cast Iron "No Hub" with stainless steel clamps

Underground Water

1. Ductile Iron Class 52
2. Copper Type "K"

Aboveground Water

1. Galvanized Pipe
2. Copper Type "L"
3. Copper Type "K"

Minimum Size of Underground Waste

- Four (4) Inch

Minimum Size of Water Service

- One and One-Half (1½) Inch

Sanitary Ejector Basin

1. Cast Iron
2. Fiber Glass

To the extent that any of these Supplements are in conflict with any of the regulations, provisions, penalties, conditions and terms of the City of Chicago Plumbing Code, 2007 Edition, adopted hereinabove by Section 15.16.010, these Supplements shall supersede, govern and control.

Section 11.00 - 15.00. Reserved.

**ARTICLE III.
SAVINGS CLAUSES,
PUBLICATION, EFFECTIVE DATE**

Section 16.00 Headings.

The headings for the articles, sections, paragraphs, and sub-paragraphs of this Ordinance are inserted solely for the convenience of reference and form no substantive part of this Ordinance nor should they be used in any interpretation or construction of any substantive provisions of this Ordinance.

Section 17.00 Severability.

The provisions of this Ordinance are hereby declared to be severable and should any provision, clause, sentence, paragraph, sub-paragraph, section, or part of this Ordinance be

determined to be in conflict with any law, statute or regulation by a court of competent jurisdiction, said provision shall be excluded and deemed inoperative, unenforceable, and as though not provided for herein, and all other provisions shall remain unaffected, unimpaired, valid and in full force and effect. It is hereby declared to be the legislative intent of the Board of Trustees that this Ordinance would have been adopted had not such unconstitutional or invalid provision, clause, sentence, paragraph, sub-paragraph, section, or part thereof had not been included.

Section 18.00 Superseder.

All code provisions, ordinances, resolutions and orders, or parts thereof, in conflict herewith, are to the extent of such conflict hereby superseded.

Section 19.00 Publication.

A full, true and complete copy of this Ordinance shall be published in pamphlet form or in a newspaper published and of general circulation within the Village as provided by the Illinois Municipal Code, as amended.

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Section 20.00 Effective date

This Ordinance shall be in full force and effect upon passage, approval and publication, as provided by law.
