ORDINANCE NO. 1192

AN ORDINANCE AUTHORIZING THE SALE BY PUBLIC AUCTION OF CERTAIN PERSONAL PROPERTY OWNED BY THE VILLAGE OF MELROSE PARK, COUNTY OF COOK, STATE OF ILLINOIS.

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WHEREAS, the Village of Melrose Park, County of Cook, State of Illinois (the “Village”) is a duly organized and existing municipality and unit of local government created under the provisions of the laws of the State of Illinois, and is operating under the provisions of the Illinois Municipal Code, and all laws amendatory thereof and supplementary thereto, with full powers to enact ordinances and adopt resolutions for the benefit of the residents of the Village; and

WHEREAS, the Village President (the “President”), the Honorable Ronald M. Serpico, the Village Clerk (the “Village Clerk”), the Honorable Mary Ann Paolantonio Salemi, having taken office on May 2, 2005, and the Board of Trustees of the Village (the “Village Board”), the Honorable John S. Conteduca, Cathleen Cossident Italia, Arturo J. Mota, Anthony J. Prignano, and Mary Ramirez Taconi, having taken office on May 14, 2007, and the Honorable Jaime Anguiano, having taken office on March 10, 2008, constitute the duly elected, qualified and acting officials of the Village; and

WHEREAS, Article 7, Section 10 of the Constitution of the State of Illinois encourages intergovernmental cooperation and authorizes units of local government to contract and associate among themselves to obtain or share services and to exercise, combine or transfer any power or function, in any manner not prohibited by law or ordinance; and

WHEREAS, the Intergovernmental Cooperation Act, 5 ILCS 220/1, et seq., and the Illinois Municipal Code 65 ILCS 5/1-1-5 et seq., and 5/11-15.1-1, et seq., authorize units of local

government to exercise their powers, privileges and authority for the purposes of intergovernmental cooperation; and

WHEREAS, the West Central Municipal Conference (the “WCMC”) is a not-for-profit corporation comprised of municipal members dedicated to fostering intergovernmental cooperation; and

WHEREAS, units of local government have joined together in cooperation with the WCMC for the purpose of auctioning or otherwise disposing of surplus vehicles, equipment, and materials; and

WHEREAS, it is no longer necessary or useful for the Village to retain ownership of certain surplus vehicles, equipment, and materials referred to and described hereinafter; and

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the President and the Board of Trustees of the Village of Melrose Park, County of Cook, State of Illinois, as follows:

ARTICLE I. IN GENERAL

Section 01. Incorporation Clause.

All of the recitals hereinbefore stated as contained in the preambles to this Ordinance are full, true and correct, and the Corporate Authorities do hereby, by reference, incorporate and make them part of this Ordinance as legislative findings.

Section 02. Purpose.

The purpose of this Ordinance is to authorize the sale by public auction of certain surplus vehicles and equipment. The ownership of said vehicles and equipment having been deemed by the President and Village Board as unnecessary.

Section 03. Invocation of Authority.

This Ordinance is adopted pursuant to the authority granted to the Village by the

Constitution of the State of Illinois and the Illinois Compiled Statutes.

Section 04. State Law Adopted.

All applicable provisions of the Illinois Compiled Statutes, including the Illinois Municipal Code, as may be amended from time to time, relating to the purposes of this Ordinance are hereby incorporated herein by reference.

Section 05 – Section 09. Reserved.

ARTICLE II.

AUTHORIZATION FOR SALE OF PERSONAL PROPERTY BY PUBLIC AUCTION

Section 10.00 Sale of Personal Property.

Pursuant to 65 ILCS, 5/11-76-4, the following personal property is hereby declared to be surplus and not needed and it is hereby found that it would be best served by the sale by public auction of the below-described personal property:

Section 10.01 Authorization to Direct Sale.

That the Village President, his designee, and/or the Director of Purchasing are hereby authorized to direct the sale of the aforesaid personal property at the next scheduled WCMC Municipal Auction.

Section 10.02 Authorization to Advertise.

That the President, his designee, and/or the Director of Purchasing are hereby authorized to direct the WCMC to advertise the sale by public auction of the above described property.

Section 10.03 Authorization to Enter into Sales Agreements.

That the President, his designee, and/or the Director of Purchasing are hereby authorized to direct the WCMC to enter into an agreement for the sale of the above described property pursuant to auction according to the terms set forth in the Specifications for the Sale of Vehicles and Equipment at the WCMC Municipal Auction.

Section 10.04 Authorization to Accept Bids.

That the President, his designee, and/or the Director of Purchasing are hereby authorized to accept the highest bid, above the minimum bid requirements set forth above, for the above described property.

Section 10.05 Authorization to Convey Title.

That upon payment in full of the auctioned price the President, his designee, and/or the Director of Purchasing are hereby authorized to direct the WCMC to convey title of any of the above described property sold at said auction.

Section 11.00 – Section 15.00. Reserved.

ARTICLE III.
HEADINGS, SAVINGS CLAUSES, PUBLICATION, EFFECTIVE DATE

Section 16.00 Headings.

The headings for the articles, sections, paragraphs and sub-paragraphs of this Ordinance are inserted solely for the convenience of reference and form no substantive part of this Ordinance nor should they be used in any interpretation or construction of any substantive provisions of this Ordinance.

Section 17.00 Severability.

The provisions of this Ordinance are hereby declared to be severable and should any provision, clause, sentence, paragraph, sub-paragraph, section, or part of this Ordinance be determined to be in conflict with any law, statute or regulation by a court of competent jurisdiction, said provision, clause, sentence, paragraph, sub-paragraph, section, or part shall be excluded and deemed inoperative, unenforceable, and as though not provided for herein, and all other provisions shall remain unaffected, unimpaired, valid and in full force and effect. It is hereby declared to be the legislative intent of the Corporate Authorities that this Ordinance would have been adopted had not such unconstitutional or invalid provision, clause, sentence, paragraph, sub-paragraph, section, or part thereof been included.

Section 18.00 Superseder.

All code provisions, ordinances, resolutions and orders, or parts thereof, in conflict herewith are, to the extent of such conflict, hereby superseded.

Section 19.00 Publication.

A full, true and complete copy of this Ordinance shall be published in pamphlet form or in a newspaper published and of general circulation within the Village as provided by the Illinois Municipal Code, as amended.

Section 20.00 Effective Date.

This Ordinance shall be in full force and effect upon its passage, approval and publication, as provided by law.
