ORDINANCE NO. 1370

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING SECTION 10.44.250 OF THE VILLAGE OF MELROSE PARK MUNICIPAL CODE REGARDING CERTAIN PARKING REGULATIONS, FOR THE VILLAGE OF MELROSE PARK, COUNTY OF COOK, STATE OF ILLINOIS.

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WHEREAS, the Village of Melrose Park, County of Cook, State of Illinois (the “Village”) is a duly organized and existing municipality and unit of local government created under the provisions of the laws of the State of Illinois, and is operating under the provisions of the Illinois Municipal Code, and all laws amendatory thereof and supplementary thereto, with full powers to enact ordinances and adopt resolutions for the benefit of the residents of the Village; and

WHEREAS, the Village President (the “President”), the Honorable Ronald M. Serpico, the Village Clerk, the Honorable Mary Ann Paolantonio Salemi, and the Board of Trustees of the Village (the “Village Board”), the Honorable Cathleen Cossident Italia, Anthony J. Prignano, Arturo J. Mota, Mary Ramirez Taconi, Jaime Anguiano and Anthony N. Abruzzo, having taken office on April 30, 2009, constitute the duly elected, qualified and acting officials of the Village; and

WHEREAS, to protect its residents and their property, the President and the Village Board (collectively, the “Corporate Authorities”) desire to ensure that motor vehicles parking on roadways within the Village are operating in a manner that is safe for the residents and the infrastructure of the Village; and

WHEREAS, previously, the Village of Melrose Park enacted prohibitions regarding the parking of certain vehicles (the “Prohibitions”); and

WHEREAS, the Village desires to amend the Village of Melrose Park Municipal Code (the “Village Code”) to adopt and classify certain parking regulations; and

WHEREAS, the Corporate Authorities have determined that it is both advisable and in the best interests of the Village and its residents to amend the Village Code to adopt the Prohibitions as part of the Village Code; and

WHEREAS, the Corporate Authorities have determined that it is necessary, advisable and in the best interests of the Village and its residents to amend Section 10.44.250 of the Village Code as set forth herein; and

WHEREAS, the enactment of this Ordinance directly pertains to and is in furtherance of the health, welfare and safety of the residents of the Village; and

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the President and the Board of the Trustees of the Village of Melrose Park, County of Cook, State of Illinois, as follows:

**ARTICLE I.
IN GENERAL**

Section 01. Incorporation Clause.

The Corporate Authorities hereby find that all of the recitals hereinbefore stated as contained in the preambles to this Ordinance are full, true and correct and do hereby, by reference, incorporate and make them part of this Ordinance as legislative findings.

Section 02. Purpose.

The purpose of this Ordinance is to amend the Village Code to prohibit commercial vehicles over a certain weight from parking on certain roadways.

Section 03. Invocation of Authority.

This Ordinance is enacted pursuant to the police powers and authority granted to the Village by the Constitution of the State of Illinois and the Illinois Compiled Statutes.

Section 04. State Law Adopted.

All applicable provisions of the Illinois Compiled Statutes, including the Illinois Municipal Code, as may be amended from time to time, relating to the purposes of this Ordinance are hereby incorporated herein by reference.

Sections 05 - 09. Reserved.

**ARTICLE II.
AMENDMENT TO CHAPTER 10.44**

Section 10.00 Amendment to Section 10.44.250 of the Village of Melrose Park Municipal Code, "Parking of noncommercial trucks, commercial vehicles, trucks, tractors and buses regulated."

Section 10.44.250 of the Village Code, titled "Parking of noncommercial trucks, commercial vehicles, trucks, tractors and buses regulated" is hereby amended notwithstanding any provision, ordinance, resolution or Village Code section to the contrary, by deleting the title and the existing first paragraph and inserting the following as the new first paragraph and revised title.

"10.44.250 Parking of Noncommercial Trucks, Commercial Vehicles, Trucks, Tractors and Buses Regulated.

No person shall stand or park any commercial vehicle, including without limitation trucks, tractors, semitrailers, trailers, tow trucks, buses and public passenger vehicles, for a longer period than is necessary for the expeditious loading or unloading of such vehicle, performance of emergency work, service work or construction work at a nearby area except as otherwise provided in this chapter with a gross weight in excess of 8,000 standard pounds on any street, alley, residential driveway, or public right of way. The provisions of this Section should not be read as a limitation of any other parking prohibition provided in the Village Code."

Section 10.01 Other Actions Authorized.

The officers, employees and/or agents of the Village shall take all action necessary or reasonably required to carry out, give effect to and consummate the transactions contemplated by this Ordinance and shall take all action necessary in conformity therewith including, without

limitation, the execution and delivery of any and all documentation required to be delivered in connection with this Ordinance.

Sections 11.00 – 15.00 Reserved.

**ARTICLE III.
HEADINGS, SAVINGS CLAUSES,
PUBLICATION, EFFECTIVE DATE**

Section 16.00 Headings.

The headings for the articles, sections, paragraphs and subparagraphs of this Ordinance are inserted solely for the convenience of reference and form no substantive part of this Ordinance nor should they be used in any interpretation or construction of any substantive provision of this Ordinance.

Section 17.00 Severability.

The provisions of this Ordinance are hereby declared to be severable and should any provision, clause, sentence, paragraph, subparagraph, section or part of this Ordinance be determined to be in conflict with any law, statute or regulation by a court of competent jurisdiction, said provision, clause, sentence, paragraph, subparagraph, section or part shall be excluded and deemed inoperative, unenforceable and as though not provided for herein, and all other provisions shall remain unaffected, unimpaired, valid and in full force and effect. It is hereby declared to be the legislative intent of the Village Board that this Ordinance would have been adopted had such unconstitutional or invalid provision, clause, sentence, paragraph, subparagraph, section or part thereof not been included.

Section 18.00 Superseder.

All code provisions, ordinances, resolutions and orders, or parts thereof, in conflict herewith are, to the extent of such conflict, hereby superseded.

Section 19.00 Publication.

A full, true and complete copy of this Ordinance shall be published in pamphlet form or in a newspaper published and of general circulation within the Village as provided by the Illinois Municipal Code, as amended.

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Section 20.00 Effective Date.

This Ordinance shall be in full force and effect upon its passage, approval and publication, as provided by law.





