One of my favorite duties as your mayor is strolling the grounds of the Taste of Melrose Park while visiting with festival patrons who are enjoying the most family-friendly and affordable festival in the area. This year we will be hosting the 35th Anniversary Taste of Melrose Park from Sept. 2-4. Visit www.melrosepark.org to download this year's entertainment schedule and the list of food booths.

It is hard to believe that in 1981 a handful of people approached the village looking for approval to host an event where residents could sell food items based on family recipes. The first festival was a success attended by a small number of area resi-

35 years later the Taste of Melrose Park has blossomed into a three-day festival visited by more than 100,000 people seeking

great food and entertainment. The Grub Street website called it, "...greatest neighborhood food festival in Chicagoland," and restaurant critic Dave Hammond wrote, "The Taste of Melrose Park is my favorite food festival of the year." The Taste of Melrose Park offers over 70 food booths, which are more booths than the Taste of Chicago. We're the only Illinois

festival to feature food booths hosted by residents serving long-held secret family recipes at \$3 or less per item, making it the lowest cost-to-consumer food festival in the state. To top that off, parking and shuttle services are free.

The Taste of Melrose Park features live entertainment on four stages. This year's lineup will include the Beatle tribute band and perennial favorite, American English, along with the Romeo Brothers, Danny Fox, The Other Three Tenors, Jesse White Tumblers, Karaoke with Greg

Rini, and the Pipes & Drums of Emerald Society – and on Saturday night, straight from the Bronx, get ready to rock out with the Bronx Wanderers, who will magically re-create the sounds of the 1950s through the '70s on our Winston Plaza main stage. I recommend catching this act; they've appeared all over the country, including Vegas.

The Taste will also offer a number of arts and crafts, and informational booths for patrons to purchase items or learn about services that enhance the quality of life in Melrose Park. The 35th Taste of Melrose Park will conclude its three-day run on Sunday night with our most spectacular fireworks show to date.

And most importantly, the Taste of Melrose Park will once again donate the proceeds from the sale of beer and wine to the Melrose Park Sports and Family Benefit Fund, which thanks to our Taste patrons, has raised over \$1 million for local charities and organizations. Now that's a piece of Taste history that is close to my heart!

No longer just a humble neighborhood food festival, the Taste of Melrose Park is a highly anticipated food and entertainment extravaganza and an event you and your family should not miss, so mark your calendars. And let's not forget the many volunteers who make this whole event happen year after year, thank you one and all! And now, I must end this letter so I can take a peek at this year's food booth list so I can plan my gastronomic strategy. Do I start with the ceviche or the Italian sausage sandwich, or maybe the pepper and egg, or perhaps the arancini? Decisions, decisions, decisions!

Dear Mark Rieger, Lieutenant, Melrose Park Police Department ...

In a time when too many police officers are being vilified by the news media for the use of excessive force and gestapo tactics, I think it is important to take the time to place the spotlight on those officers, and there are many of you, who exemplify the oath they have taken to serve and protect the community where they work.

On June 28, a Tuesday, at approximately 1100 hours, the security staff at Gottlieb Hospital responded to a report of two individuals who were causing a disturbance by airing their domestic issues in a loud and obtrusive fashion. On our arrival we were able to calm the situation. However, one of the arguing parties did call 911 and asked that his wife be taken to another facility. Melrose Park paramedics arrived with the police shortly after.

Officer Skeens (badge #21) was one of the responding officers along with Officer Rodriguez (badge #71). Skeens and Rodriguez did an excellent job in de-escalating a rather volatile situation involving an estranged husband and his wife who were going through a divorce and desperately seemed to be seeking to air their troubles in a public forum. Their compassionate approach to the situation quickly de-escalated the husband's anxiety. Officer Skeens did not shout order or approach the situation with a blanket solution. She took the time to separate and listen to the two parties. Her and Rodriguez's approach was at once authoritative and subtle. They were in control of the situation and I don't even think the subjects realized it. They spoke with concern and took the time to listen to each of the parties. Skeens was especially instrumental in getting the husband to decompress and realize his actions were not helping himself or his wife. She conducted herself with exemplary professionalism. Her and Rodriguez embodied the very definition of excellent community policing.

In an era where the relationship between communities and their law enforcement agencies is strained at the best of times, and violently volatile at the worst, it is too easy to focus on the negatives and forget all the positives. Let's face it, there has even been some friction between our agencies. (Too many egos getting in the way of cooperative cooperation?). Today, I put my ego aside and would like to take this opportunity to thank officers Skeens and Rodriguez for their professionalism. Job well-done, officers! Bravo! Kudos to you both! In fact, I would like to thank all the officers at the Melrose Park Police Department, from Danny Richter to Mark Loochtan to yourself, Lt. Rieger, and to all the men and women who put on the uniform and have sworn the oath to "Protect and Serve." You are the thin blue line and I appreciate your service – one and all.



No Water Rate Increase for Melrose Park Residents

Mayor Serpico brings you good news! As former chairman of the West Central Municipal

Conference's Regional Water Task Force, Serpico led a coalition of local officials in a fight to stop rate increases the city of Chicago was charging suburban municipalities for Lake Michigan water. Not only did the coalition take up the fight, but concerned Melrose Park residents also got involved and collected early 3,000 signatures protesting these increases, which Serpico presented to the mayor of Chicago. In the past, the village absorbed the first two water rate increases in order to keep Melrose Park an affordable place to live



and now, thanks to the hard work of our residents and fellow suburban mayors, the city of Chicago is not increasing our water rate for 2016.

Melrose Park Water Quality

Some more good news! The daily water flow provided from Melrose Park's three pumping stations can be 10-14 million gallons per day, and you can rest assured that it's of the purest quality. All of this equipment requires daily, quarterly and yearly maintenance and inspections so that the Water Management System is working properly and at its fullest potential at all times.

Every two weeks we take water samples from 15 different sections of town to test for coliform. These samples are sent to an independent lab that issues a report on their findings. These lab reports continue to show our water is free of coliform.

The village also tests the water for chlorine levels and adds, as needed, the required chlorine to insure clean water to its consumers. Our water is tested every three years for lead and copper. Our last test, completed in 2014, showed our water free from dangerous levels of lead and copper.

Life in Melrose Park is pretty great with one of the lowest suburban water rates around and good clean water for all due to the village's constant monitoring and testing.



On Wednesday, July 27, the village of Melrose Park and Veterans Park District partnered to host a dedication and monument unveiling ceremony at the new Vietnam Veterans Memorial Park located in the River Woods area of the village.

VPD Executive Director Donna Peluso, opened the event with a touching welcome to the large crowd that included family members and friends of the following courageous soldiers – Dwight Farwell Bennett, Jr., James Patrick Califf, Russell Martin Erickson, Russell Eugene Gedeon, Frank R. Gilchrist, Jr., Michael John Havard, Thomas Howard Heise, Robert Edward Johnson, Charles Norbert Kowalk, David Joseph Latoria, Albert Louis Lazzarotto, Joseph Anthony Maggio, Jr., Matthew Paul Malczynski, Vernon Arthur Manheim, Jr., Olaf Thomas Olsen and Jon Peter Turk – American heroes memorialized on the Vietnam Veterans Memorial Park monument, who will forever be remembered for their sacrifice while serving our country during the Vietnam War.

Peluso spoke on the heartwarming opportunity Mayor Serpico approached the park district with and the concept of a remarkable new park honorably constructed for a worthy cause and built via an intergovernmental agreement between VPD and the village of Melrose Park.

We gather here today to dedicate this park in the memory of 16 Veterans Park District brave, young soldiers who played on our fields, danced at our teen dances, swam in our pools and stole a kiss or two on our benches," said Peluso. "These brave young soldiers who, 50 years ago, left their friends, families, wives and lovers, and fearlessly sacrificed their lives so that our freedom may be preserved and we may live in a peaceful nation. We are extremely proud to honor and respect them as our heroes and to welcome them home."

Following the welcome, Mayor Serpico addressed the audience and proudly thanked the park district and everyone involved in bringing the respectful thought of a Vietnam Veterans Memorial Park to fruition. Serpico expressed his gratitude for the courageous efforts of all the bold U.S. military men and women who are currently serving and those who have served our country throughout the years, and the truly heroic Americans they are.

Mayor Serpico also individually recognized several Vietnam vets in the crowd and commented on the personal, gallant and powerful role of each soldier and the bold, unwavering accomplishments they had during their time in Vietnam.

The hard work of VPD Commissioner Len Gassmann, who was helpful in the planning process of the park and responsible for the beautifully designed monument installed at the site, was acknowledged, as well as the commitment of Bill Otte, VPD superintendent of Building and Grounds, who treated this project as a labor of love.

A Flag Ceremony, Rifle Salute and Posting of the Colors was presented by the American Legion of Franklin Park, Post 974, vocalist Gianna Capra Uroni performed the national anthem and *God Bless America*, and WWII veteran Angelo Provenzano led the Pledge of Allegiance. Vietnam War veteran Angelo Egizio acknowledged the efforts of MP/VPD on behalf of the Vietnam vets, prayers were given by Deacon Ray Behrendt of Sacred Heart Church, with Sgt. Patrick Manthe and Staff Sgt. Carlos M. Torres from the Melrose Park Army Recruiting Center unveiling the monument. The veterans of Winfield Scott VFW Post 2193 were recognized and graciously thanked for their generous donation for the flagpole installed at the park. The village of Melrose Park and Veterans Park District were honored to have the families and friends of fallen soldiers Russell E. Gedeon, Frank R. Gilchrist, Jr., Michael J. Havard, Joseph A. Maggio, Jr., and Vernon A. Manheim, Jr., in attendance, as well as veterans from past wars knowingly the Vietnam War, Korean War and WWII.



Village of Melrose Park **Garage Sale Notice**



The rules on garage sales held in the village of Melrose Park are as follows: Garage sales will be held on the third weekend only during the months of May, June, July, August and September. Sales are to be conducted on Thursday, Friday and Saturday of the designated weekends. No sales are allowed on Sundays.

The remaining dates for 2016 are Sept. 15-17.

Garage sales shall be conducted only during the hours of 9 a.m.-5

p.m.

No permit is needed for garage sales, however the following rules must be followed:

- No garage sales may be conducted in apartment buildings.
- No garage sales in the frontyard, i.e. on the grass.
- All garage sales to be conducted in backyard, garage or driveway.
- All sale items to be displayed on tables not on the ground.
- No sale items shall be located and no sale activity shall be conducted in the frontyard area on the premises of any public sidewalk, parkway area or other public property.
- No sale signs, handbills or other advertising material shall be located or posted upon public parkway or on public property, signs, poles or light poles within the village of Melrose Park.
- Signs advertising the sales shall not exceed 3-by-5 feet and may be located only in the frontyard (private property) of the address having the garage sale and must be removed immediately after the sale.
- The sale will be conducted without the use of outdoor loud speakers, amplification equipment or illuminated advertising devices.

Any person violating these rules shall be subject to a fine not to exceed \$500. A copy of the garage sale rules is available at the Village Hall.

New Bike Racks Coming to Melrose Park

The village of Melrose Park is one of four suburban Cook County municipalities to receive a grant to purchase new bike racks. Funded by Cook County Department of Health's Healthy HotSpot initiative and administered by Active Transportation Alliance, the grant will provide approximately \$3,000 worth of new bike racks and a bike rack siting plan. The village is currently considering locations for the racks, which may include the Metra Station, Winston Plaza, the Broadway Business District, the Melrose Park Public Library, Village Hall, and local parks.

The bike racks are coming at a perfect time for the village as it makes strides to becoming more bicycle and pedestrian friendly. The North Avenue bicycle and pedestrian path is under construction, and the village will soon unveil its first-ever Active Transportation Plan, also funded by the Healthy HotSpot Initiative.

The Healthy HotSpot Initiative is an effort led by the Cook County Department of Public Health, which addresses community-level changes that make the healthy choice the easy choice. The funding is focused on creating or strengthening the places where residents live, work, learn, worship, play or receive health care to make it easier for them to make healthful choices and take charge of their health, especially in communities that have less access to practical, readily available options.

The program is funded by the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services (HHS) initiative to support public health efforts to reduce chronic diseases, promote healthier lifestyles, reduce health disparities, and control health care spending.

The bike rack sites will be finalized in early fall and will be installed by next spring.

MP's Keep Illinois Beautiful Application Approved!

Once again the village of Melrose Park received outstanding news from the West Cook County Solid Waste Agency that its 2016 Keep Illinois Beautiful Application for Illinois EPA Grant Funds was selected and approved by Keep West Cook Beautiful, a certified affiliate of Keep America Beautiful, Inc., which also includes affiliation in Keep Illinois Beautiful, Inc.

This funding, along with the IEPA's Streambank Clean-up and Lakeshore Enhancement (SCALE) funding, supports the villages Annual Silver Creek Cleanup Program that's held in the spring of each year.

Since 1953, Keep America Beautiful and its affiliates have been at the forefront of public service messages, creating awareness among Americans about litter, the environment and personal responsibility.

Keep America Beautiful has three primary areas of focus – litter reduction, waste minimization and beautification, and operates through a national grassroots network of nearly 600 certified affiliates and more than 1,000 organizations that participate in its programs.

Melrose Park is proud of its Silver Creek Cleanup Program and the close to 100 community volunteers who participate annually for the past 17 years. We are extremely grateful for the financial assistance from the Illinois EPA that helps absorb some of the costs of this community beautification initiative.



Street Repaving

Important Reminder Regarding Changes in License Plate Renewal



The Secretary of State's office is no longer sending out Annual License Plate Renewal Notifications. This means drivers are on their own to remember when their license plates renew. Unfortunately, most people do not think about their renewal until they get

their notification. The end result is that people are now getting ticketed for missing their renewal deadline.

As a solution, you can sign up to receive an electronic notification which will also allow you the option to renew your license plates online.

To sign up to have a renewal notification sent to you by email follow these steps:

Go to the Secretary of State's website

www.cyberdriveillinois.com.

- On the right side of page click on the box that says "Email my renewal notice."
- It will then ask for your Registration ID and Pin number. These numbers are on your current License Registration Card. Then click submit.
- It will then take you to a page that shows Owner's Name, License Plate Number, Year and Make of Car. At the bottom of the screen it will ask if these are correct. Assuming correct, check yes.
- It will then ask for your email address. Complete, click, submit.
- It will then ask if you would like to enroll another vehicle. If yes, click on "enroll another license." If no, you are finished.

It would not hurt to go back into the site and recheck your work to make sure you're registered.

Village of Melrose Park Construction Notice Construction Hours


No construction or alteration activities shall be carried on between the nighttime hours of 7 p.m. and 7 a.m. on Monday, Tuesday, Wednesday, Thursday or Friday. On Saturday, no construction or alteration activities shall be carried on between the nighttime hours of 5 p.m. and 8 a.m. On Sunday and federal holidays, no construction or alteration activities shall be carried on between the nighttime hours of 5 p.m. and 10 a.m. Construction and alteration activities on Sundays and federal holidays shall not be accompanied by loud or annoying noises except in the case of an emergency. Emergency

operations necessitating deviation from this section shall not be initiated until special permission is obtained from the director of Public Works. Construction or alteration activities with regard to public improvements and public service utilities, shall be exempt from this section.

Any person violating this section shall be fined not less that fifty dollars (\$50), nor

more than seven hundred fifty dollars (\$750), for each offense, and each day's violation of the same shall constitute a separate and distinct offense.



West Nile Virus

The Illinois Department of Public Health (IDPH) has confirmed the first West Nile virus positive bird and mosquito batches reported in Illinois for 2012. Although it is a little earlier in the season than we normally find it, it is not unheard of.

Last year 19 counties in Illinois reported a West Nile virus positive mosquito batch, bird and/or human case. A total of 34 Illinois residents contracted West Nile virus disease and three died. No human cases of West Nile virus have been reported so far this year.

Surveillance for West Nile virus in Illinois includes laboratory tests on mosquito batches, dead crows, blue jays, robins and other perching birds, as well as testing sick horses and humans with West Nile-like disease symptoms. People who observe a sick or dying crow, blue jay, robin or other perching bird should contact their local health department, which will determine if the bird will be picked up for testing.

West Nile virus is transmitted through the bite of a mosquito that has picked up the virus by feeding on an infected bird. Common West Nile virus symptoms include fever, nausea, headache and muscle aches. Symptoms may last from a few days to a few weeks. However, four out of five people infected with West Nile virus will not show any symptoms. In rare cases, severe illness including meningitis or encephalitis, or even death, can occur. People older than 50 are at higher risk for severe illness from West Nile Virus.

Five Common Myths About West Nile Virus

Myth #1: There's not much I can do about West Nile virus.

Truth: There is a lot that you, personally, can do to reduce your chance of West Nile virus infection.

- Reduce the number of mosquito bites you get. Make a habit of using insect repellent with DEET when outdoors. Spray repellent on exposed skin and clothing. Prime mosquito-biting hours are usually dusk to dawn. Pay special attention to protection during these hours, or avoid being outdoors.
- You can reduce the number of mosquitoes around your home. Mosquitoes breed in standing water, so check your yard once a week: get rid of containers that aren't being used, empty water from flower pots, change water in bird baths and maintain clean gutters.
- Make sure window and door screens are in good condition. Have an older neighbor or family member? See if they need help installing or repairing screens.

Myth #2: Kids are at the most danger of getting sick from West Nile virus.

Truth: People over 50 are at the highest risk for developing severe West Nile disease.

- Relatively few children have been reported with severe West Nile Virus disease. By contrast, most of the deaths due to WNV during 2002 were among people over 50 years old. Half of those deaths were among people over 77 years old.
- It is always a good idea for children to avoid mosquito bites, but it's also important for adults especially older adults – to take steps to avoid mosquito bites.

Myth #3: It's only people who are already in poor health who have to worry about West Nile virus. Truth: Healthy, active older adults who spend time working and exercising outdoors have been affected by severe West Nile virus infection.

• Being over 50 is a risk factor for developing severe West Nile disease if infected with the virus. There is a risk of getting mosquito bites while leading an active life outdoors. This doesn't mean you have to stay inside – it does mean that it's important to use repellent when you go outside.

Myth #4: Repellents containing DEET are not safe.

Truth: Repellents containing DEET are very safe when used according to directions.

- Because DEET is so widely used, a great deal of testing has been done. When manufacturers seek registration with the US Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) for products such as DEET, laboratory testing regarding both short-term and long-term health effects must be carried out.
- There are products with different strengths (percentage of DEET) available. The longer the protection you need the higher percent of DEET needed.
- Repellent with DEET can be used for both adults and children, according to directions

Myth #5: As long as my area has a mosquito control program, I don't have to worry about using repellent.

Truth: Mosquito control activities don't eliminate every mosquito, so personal protection is still important.

- Public activities, such as using products to kill mosquito larvae and adult mosquitoes, are one part of control. Personal protection, such as using repellent, keeping window screens in good condition, and control of household breeding sites are other important steps.
- Collaboration between the community, the family and the individual is needed to achieve the best prevention of West Nile virus infection.

West Nile Virus Facts

What is West Nile Virus?

West Nile virus (WNV) is a potentially serious illness. Experts believe WNV is established as a seasonal epidemic in North America that flares up in the summer and continues into the fall. This fact sheet contains important information that can help you recognize and prevent West Nile virus.

What Can I do to Prevent WNV?

The easiest and best way to avoid WNV is to prevent mosquito bites.

- When you are outdoors, use insect repellents containing an EPA-registered insect repellent. Follow the directions on the package.
- Many mosquitoes are most active at dusk and dawn. Be sure to use insect repellent and wear long sleeves and pants at these times or consider staying indoors during these hours.
- Make sure you have good screens on your windows and doors to keep mosquitoes out.
- Get rid of mosquito breeding sites by emptying standing water from flower pots, buckets and barrels. Change the water in pet dishes and replace the water in bird baths weekly. Drill holes in tire swings so water drains out. Keep children's wading pools empty and on their sides when they aren't being used.

What Are the Symptoms of WNV?

- Serious Symptoms in a Few People About one in 150 people infected with WNV will develop severe illness. The severe symptoms can include high fever, headache, neck stiffness, stupor, disorientation, coma, tremors, convulsions, muscle weakness, vision loss, numbness and paralysis. These symptoms may last several weeks, and neurological effects may be permanent.
- Milder Symptoms in Some People Up to 20 percent of the people who become infected will display symptoms which can include fever, headache, and body aches, nausea, vomiting, and sometimes swollen lymph glands or a skin rash on the chest, stomach and back. Symptoms can last for as short as a few days, though even healthy people have been sick for several weeks.
- No Symptoms in Most People Approximately 80 percent of people (about four out of five) who are infected with WNV will not show any symptoms at all, but there is no way to know in advance if you will develop an illness or not.

How Does West Nile Virus Spread?

- Infected Mosquitoes Most often, WNV is spread by the bite of an infected mosquito. Mosquitoes become infected when they feed on infected birds. Infected mosquitoes can then spread WNV to humans and other animals when they bite.
- Transfusions, Transplants and Mother-to-Child In a very small number of cases, WNV also has been spread through blood transfusions, organ transplants, breastfeeding and even during pregnancy from mother to baby.
- Not through touching. WNV is not spread through casual contact such as touching or kissing a person with the virus.

How Soon Do Infected People Get Sick?

People typically develop symptoms between three and 14 days after they are bitten by the infected mosquito.

How Is WNV Infection Treated?

There is no specific treatment for WNV infection. In cases with milder symptoms, people experience symptoms such as fever and aches that pass on their own, although illness may last weeks to months even in healthy persons. In more severe cases, people usually need to go to the hospital where they can receive supportive treatment including intravenous fluids, help with breathing, and nursing care.

What Should I Do if I Think I Have WNV?

Milder WNV illness improves on its own, and people do not necessarily need to seek medical attention for this infection though they may choose to do so. If you develop symptoms of severe WNV illness, such as unusually severe headaches or confusion, seek medical attention immediately. Severe WNV illness usually requires hospitalization. Pregnant women and nursing mothers are encouraged to talk to their doctor if they develop symptoms that could be WNV.

What is the Risk of Getting Sick from WNV?

- People Over 50 at Higher Risk to Get Severe Illness People over the age of 50 are more likely to develop serious symptoms of WNV if they do get sick and should take special care to avoid mosquito bites.
- Being Outside Means You're at Risk The more time you're outdoors, the more time you could be bitten by an infected mosquito. Pay attention to avoiding
 mosquito bites if you spend a lot of time outside, either working or playing.
- Risk Through Medical Procedures is Very Low All donated blood is checked for WNV before being used. The risk of getting WNV through blood transfusions and organ transplants is very small, and should not prevent people who need surgery from having it. If you have concerns, talk to your doctor.
- Pregnancy and Nursing do not Increase Risk of Becoming Infected with WNV The risk that WNV may present to a fetus or an infant infected through breastmilk is still being evaluated. Talk with your care provider if you have concerns.

What is the CDC Doing About WNV?

CDC is working with state and local health departments, the Food and Drug Administration and other government agencies, as well as private industry, to prepare for and prevent new cases of WNV. Some things CDC is doing include:

- Coordinating a nationwide electronic database where states share information about WNV.
- Helping states develop and carry out improved mosquito prevention and control programs.
- Developing better, faster tests to detect and diagnose WNV.
- Creating new education tools and programs for the media, the public, and health professionals.
- Opening new testing laboratories for WNV.
- Working with partners to develop vaccines.

What Else Should I Know?

If you find a dead bird don't handle the body with your bare hands. Contact the Health Department at (708) 343-4000, for instructions on reporting and disposing of the body. They may tell you to dispose of the bird after they log your report.

Flooding – What You Need to Know

Flooding is a coast to coast threat to the United States and its territories nearly every day of the year.

Flooding typically occurs when prolonged rain falls over several days, when intense rain falls over a short period of time, or when an ice or debris jam causes a river or stream to overflow onto the surrounding area. Flooding can also result from the failure of a water control structure, such as a levee or dam. The most common cause of flooding is water due to rain and/or snowmelt that accumulates faster than soils can absorb it or rivers can carry it away. Approximately 75 percent of all presidential disaster declarations are associated with flooding.

What is the Difference Between a Flood Watch and a Flood Warning Issued by the National Weather Service?


FLOODING AHEAD TURN AROUND DON'T DROWN

- Flash Flood Warning: Take Action! A Flash Flood Warning is issued when a flash flood is imminent or occurring. If you are in a flood prone area move immediately to high ground. A flash flood is a sudden violent flood that can take from minutes to hours to develop. It is even possible to experience a flash flood in areas not immediately receiving rain.
- Flood Warning: Take Action! A Flood Warning is issued when the hazardous weather event is imminent or already happening. A Flood Warning is issued when flooding is imminent or occurring.
- Flood Watch: Be Prepared: A Flood Watch is issued when conditions are favorable for a specific hazardous weather event to occur. A Flood Watch is issued when conditions are favorable for flooding. It does not mean flooding will occur, but it is possible.
- Flood Advisory: Be Aware: A Flood Advisory is issued when a specific weather event that is forecast to occur may become a nuisance. A Flood Advisory is issued when flooding is not expected to be bad enough to issue a warning. However, it may cause significant inconvenience, and if caution is not exercised, it could lead to situations that may threaten life and/or property.

Flash floods are exactly what the name suggests: floods that happen in a flash! Flash floods generally develop within six hours of the immediate cause. Causes of flash flooding include heavy rain, ice or debris jams, and levee or dam failure. These floods exhibit a rapid rise of water over low-lying areas. In some cases, flooding may even occur well away from where heavy rain initially fell. This is especially common in the western United States where low lying areas may be very dry one minute and filled with rushing water from upstream the next.

There are many reasons that flash floods occur, but one of the most common is the result of copious amounts of rainfall from thunderstorms that cause flash flooding. This can also occur when slow-moving or multiple thunderstorms move over the same area. These sudden downpours can rapidly change the water levels in a stream or creek and turn small waterways into violent, raging rivers. Urban areas are especially prone to flash floods due to the large amounts of concrete and asphalt surfaces that do not allow water to penetrate into the soil easily.

Not everyone is at a place in their life where they can dedicate a couple of years to getting a degree. Triton College understands that. 

The members of the District 89 Leadership Team dedicated themselves to a summer focused on actions to support the district improvement plan developed in partnership with Illinois CSI. Worthy targets in English language arts, mathematics and climate/culture set the stage to prepare for a productive 2016-2017 school year.

Many of the actions supporting the district worthy targets were centered on summer professional development. In the 2016-2017 school year, we have adopted the McGraw-Hill Wonders

reading series, per our participation in professional development during Institute Days. This professional development will align with the district worthy target on supporting teachers in implementing the new textbook adoption.

Participation by administrators and teachers in the University of Illinois at Chicago Summer Institute "Engaging All Students in Meaningful Mathematics"

focused on implementing the Common Core State Standards for Math using high-quality resources. Experienced facilitators offered engaging sessions on a wide range of topics that supported mathematics teaching and learning during the two-day institute aligned to the district worthy target of implementing the math curriculum with fidelity. Summer learning opportunities integrated the newly acquired resources of Lexia and Compass online learning for students in kindergarten through seventh grade that will support the use of data for student interventions, which supports both the math and English language arts worthy targets.

The District 89 Leadership Team is collaborating with OverAchieve Consulting, the Academy for Urban School Leadership and Illinois CSI to develop a cohesive district plan supporting student outcomes. We held planning meetings this summer to prepare for professional development for district administrators with support from all three partners. This professional development will prepare administrators to complete walkthroughs for adult practice measures, to use data analysis to plan instruction and to align school plans with district improvement plans.

This summer the district took a deep dive into its worthy target actions, worked to align all partners focused on the district's goals and worthy targets, and communicated the district work to all stakeholders.

A Remarkable 125 Year Celebration for Dalpiaz Brothers

Two brothers who were raised in Melrose Park and attended Our Lady of Mt. Carmel School, followed by their eight siblings, recently celebrated a total of 125 years as Scalabrinian priests.

Fr. Gino Dalpiaz and Fr. Alex Dalpiaz were recently honored at a Gala Dinner Dance held at The Carlisle in Lombard on Saturday, May 28. Fr. Gino celebrated his 65th anniversary of ordination and Fr. Alex his 60th anniversary of ordination. This remarkable celebration was sponsored by Santa Maria Addolorata Parish of Chicago where Fr. Gino is currently an assistant and Fr. Alex in the past served as pastor for nine years.

Fr. Gino Dalpiaz was born Dec. 2, 1926, in Melrose Park, the first-born in an immigrant family of 10 children – six girls and four boys. In 1957, a younger brother, Fr. Alex, also became a Scalabrinian priest. He was for many years a Scalabrinian missionary in Australia, Argentina and Columbia.

Although Fr. Gino had always wanted to be a Franciscan priest like his uncle in Italy, he was finally persuaded in 1939 to enter Sacred Heart Seminary, the Scalabrinian Seminary in Melrose Park. In November 1947, he was sent to Rome, Italy, for six years to complete his philosophical and theological studies at the Pontifical Gregorian University. He was ordained a Scalabrinian priest on July 8, 1951, in Rome. He finally came back to the United States in 1953, where he spent the next 11 years as a teacher, spiritual director and novice master in the Scalabrinian seminaries in the United States.

In 1964, Fr. Gino began full-time work in various Scalabrinian parishes in the U.S... St. Peter Church in Syracuse; Our Lady of Mount Carmel Church in Melrose Park; and St. Anthony Church in Chicago. From 1965 to 1974, he spent nine beautiful years as pastor of Our Lady of Pompeii Church in Chicago. From 1981-1986, he was back in Rome as a member of the general secretariat of the Scalabrinian General House. In 1988, he was asked to be director of the Italian Cultural Center in Stone Park, Ill., where he remained, except for a brief interval, until 2006, when he was assigned as spiritual director at the Scalabrinian House of Theology in Chicago. In 2010 (until present), Fr. Gino became associate pastor of Santa Maria Addolorata Church in Chicago.

Fr. Alex Dalpiaz was born Feb. 16, 1930, in Melrose Park, the third of 10 children and the second priest. Raised in Melrose Park, he attended Our Lady of Mt. Carmel School and then Immaculate Conception High School in Elmhurst.

Fr. Alex entered the Sacred Heart Seminary in Melrose Park in 1947 and has learned to speak four languages English, Italian, Spanish and Portuguese.

While in the seminary he always knew that he wanted to be a missionary traveling and helping immigrants.

On June 10, 1956, Fr. Alex was ordained a Scalabrinian priest by Archbishop William O'Brien in Our Lady of Pompeii Church, Chicago. He began serving in North Queensland, Australia, as associate pastor for three years and pastor for two years at St. John's Church – missionary work with Italian emigrants (1956-1961).

Fr. Alex work also includes: Crespano, Italy, as assistant novice master (1961-1962); Tasmania, Australia, as pastor of San Carlos Church – missionary work with Italian emigrants (1962-1964); Buenos Aires, Argentina, as director of Apostleship of the Sea and chaplain with English-speaking people, as provincial administrator (1966-1978), as director of Primary; Secondary and Technical School for Emigrants and chaplain of Chilean migrants (1978-1979); Cucuta, Colombia, as director of Centro de Migraciones/coordinator of Migration Office (1979-1982); Bogota, Colombia, as national director for Department of Migration for Episcopal Conference (1982-1986), during this time he also served Mother Teresa of Calcutta as her translator for three days; Chicago, III., as pastor of Santa Maria Addolorata Church (1986-1995). He returned to Bogota, Columbia, as executive secretary of the International Catholic Migration Commission (1995-2003); then to Winter Garden, Fla., as pastor of Resurrection Catholic Church in Diocese of Orlando (2003-2010). In 2010, Fr. Alex became officially retired and served as chaplain and nursing home assistant at Villa Rosa Nursing Home in Washington, DC. He is presently in residence at Our Lady Queen of Peace Parish where he assists at the parish and the Casa San Carlos Retreat Center, both in Delray Beach, Fla.

Congratulations to Fr. Gino and Fr. Alex, and members of their wonderful family on this well-deserved recognition.
