Silver Creek Restoration Project Phase Four

Phase Four of the Silver Creek Restoration Project (area between Fifth Avenue and First Avenue) is in the process of design finalization and will start in late fall or early spring, as weather permits. This restoration project restores the natural balance of the creek by restoring the embankment and bringing back native landscape and shrubbery along with aquatic habitat. This is an invaluable stream system that provides storm water runoff, flood management and many other benefits for the residents of Melrose Park.




Village of Melrose Park Dog Park

The Village of Melrose Park Dial a Ride Program was initiated in 2000 to provide residents of our community with a new transportation resource to any location in the Melrose Park boundaries. Residents are encouraged to use the program to do their everyday needs such as grocery shopping, doctor appointments, etc. We are also handicapped accessible.

This service is available to residents Monday thru Friday from 8 a.m. to 4 p.m. To make a reservation, please call (708) 343-7047. You can make appointments from the hours of 9 a.m. to 5 p.m., Monday thru Friday. We are closed on Saturdays and Sundays and all major holidays. To book an appointment or make a cancellation, you must call at least 24 hours in advance.

Policies and Procedures

Only one reservation per rider per day. NO EXCEPTIONS!

Only two appointments a week can be made for miscellaneous use such as grocery shopping etc. Anyone using the van for doctor appointments, etc., may use the van up to three times a week.

You must stay at your destination you are going to for a minimum of an hour. Any residents of Victory Centre MUST go with the group provided at their center for grocery shopping, etc. Any doctor appointment can be made with us.

Only three shopping bags per rider. Forgotten items in the van will be returned at the next pickup date. Please note that our service is getting more popular every day so we will try to accommodate your needs to the best of our ability.

No construction or alteration activities shall be carried on between

the nighttime hours of 7 p.m. and 7 a.m. on Monday, Tuesday, Wednesday, Thursday or Friday. On Saturday, no construction or alteration activities shall be carried on between the nighttime hours of 5 p.m. and 8 a.m. On Sunday and federal holi-

days, no construction or alteration activities shall be carried on between the nighttime hours of 5 p.m. and 10

a.m. Construction and alteration activities on

Sundays and federal holidays shall not be accompanied by loud or annoying noises except in the case of an emergency. Emergency operations necessitating deviation from this section shall not be initiated until special permission is obtained from the director of Public Works. Construction or alteration activities with regard to public improvements and public service utilities, shall be exempt from this section.

Any person violating this section shall be fined not less that fifty dollars (\$50), nor more than seven hundred fifty dollars (\$750), for each offense, and each day's violation of the same shall constitute a separate and distinct offense.

West Nile Virus

The Illinois Department of Public Health (IDPH) has confirmed the first West Nile virus positive bird and mosquito batches reported in Illinois for 2012. Although it is a little earlier in the season than we normally find it, it is not unheard of.

Last year 19 counties in Illinois reported a West Nile virus positive mosquito batch, bird and/or human case. A total of 34 Illinois residents contracted West Nile virus disease and three died. No human cases of West Nile virus have been reported so far this year.

Surveillance for West Nile virus in Illinois includes laboratory tests on mosquito batches, dead crows, blue jays, robins and other perching birds, as well as testing sick horses and humans with West Nile-like disease symptoms. People who observe a sick or dying crow, blue jay, robin or other perching bird should contact their local health department, which will determine if the bird will be picked up for testing.

West Nile virus is transmitted through the bite of a mosquito that has picked up the virus by feeding on an infected bird. Common West Nile virus symptoms include fever, nausea, headache and muscle aches. Symptoms may last from a few days to a few weeks. However, four out of five people infected with West Nile virus will not show any symptoms. In rare cases, severe illness including meningitis or encephalitis, or even death, can occur. People older than 50 are at higher risk for severe illness from West Nile Virus.

Five Common Myths About West Nile Virus

Myth #1: There's not much I can do about West Nile virus.

Truth: There is a lot that you, personally, can do to reduce your chance of West Nile virus infection.

- Reduce the number of mosquito bites you get. Make a habit of using insect repellent with DEET when outdoors. Spray repellent on exposed skin and clothing. Prime mosquito-biting hours are usually dusk to dawn. Pay special attention to protection during these hours, or avoid being outdoors.
- You can reduce the number of mosquitoes around your home. Mosquitoes breed in standing water, so check your yard once a week: get rid of containers that aren't being used, empty water from flower pots, change water in bird baths and maintain clean gutters.
- Make sure window and door screens are in good condition. Have an older neighbor or family member? See if they need help installing or repairing screens.

Myth #2: Kids are at the most danger of getting sick from West Nile virus.

Truth: People over 50 are at the highest risk for developing severe West Nile disease.

- Relatively few children have been reported with severe West Nile Virus disease. By contrast, most of the deaths due to WNV during 2002 were among people over 50 years old. Half of those deaths were among people over 77 years old.
- It is always a good idea for children to avoid mosquito bites, but it's also important for adults especially older adults to take steps to avoid mosquito bites.

Myth #3: It's only people who are already in poor health who have to worry about West Nile virus.

Truth: Healthy, active older adults who spend time working and exercising outdoors have been affected by severe West Nile virus infection.

• Being over 50 is a risk factor for developing severe West Nile disease if infected with the virus. There is a risk of getting mosquito bites while leading an active life outdoors. This doesn't mean you have to stay inside – it does mean that it's important to use repellent when you go outside.

Myth #4: Repellents containing DEET are not safe.

Truth: Repellents containing DEET are very safe when used according to directions.

- Because DEET is so widely used, a great deal of testing has been done. When manufacturers seek registration with the US Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) for products such as DEET, laboratory testing regarding both short-term and long-term health effects must be carried out.
- There are products with different strengths (percentage of DEET) available. The longer the protection you need the higher percent of DEET needed.
- Repellent with DEET can be used for both adults and children, according to directions

Myth #5: As long as my area has a mosquito control program, I don't have to worry about using repellent.

Truth: Mosquito control activities don't eliminate every mosquito, so personal protection is still important.

- Public activities, such as using products to kill mosquito larvae and adult mosquitoes, are one part of control. Personal protection, such as using repellent, keeping window screens in good condition, and control of household breeding sites are other important steps.
- Collaboration between the community, the family and the individual is needed to achieve the best prevention of West Nile virus infection.

West Nile Virus Facts

What is West Nile Virus?

West Nile virus (WNV) is a potentially serious illness. Experts believe WNV is established as a seasonal epidemic in North America that flares up in the summer and continues into the fall. This fact sheet contains important information that can help you recognize and prevent West Nile virus.

What Can I do to Prevent WNV?

The easiest and best way to avoid WNV is to prevent mosquito bites.

- When you are outdoors, use insect repellents containing an EPA-registered insect repellent. Follow the directions on the package.
- Many mosquitoes are most active at dusk and dawn. Be sure to use insect repellent and wear long sleeves and pants at these times or consider staying indoors during these hours.
- Make sure you have good screens on your windows and doors to keep mosquitoes out.
- Get rid of mosquito breeding sites by emptying standing water from flower pots, buckets and barrels. Change the water in pet dishes and replace the water in bird baths weekly. Drill holes in tire swings so water drains out. Keep children's wading pools empty and on their sides when they aren't being used.

What Are the Symptoms of WNV?

- Serious Symptoms in a Few People About one in 150 people infected with WNV will develop severe illness. The severe symptoms can include high fever, headache, neck stiffness, stupor, disorientation, coma, tremors, convulsions, muscle weakness, vision loss, numbness and paralysis. These symptoms may last several weeks, and neurological effects may be permanent.
- Milder Symptoms in Some People Up to 20 percent of the people who become infected will display symptoms which can include fever, headache, and body aches, nausea, vomiting, and sometimes swollen lymph glands or a skin rash on the chest, stomach and back. Symptoms can last for as short as a few days, though even healthy people have been sick for several weeks.
- No Symptoms in Most People Approximately 80 percent of people (about four out of five) who are infected with WNV will not show any symptoms at all, but there is no way to know in advance if you will develop an illness or not.

How Does West Nile Virus Spread?

- Infected Mosquitoes Most often, WNV is spread by the bite of an infected mosquito. Mosquitoes become infected when they feed on infected birds. Infected mosquitoes can then spread WNV to humans and other animals when they bite.
- Transfusions, Transplants and Mother-to-Child In a very small number of cases, WNV also has been spread through blood transfusions, organ transplants, breastfeeding and even during pregnancy from mother to baby.
- Not through touching. WNV is not spread through casual contact such as touching or kissing a person with the virus.

How Soon Do Infected People Get Sick?

People typically develop symptoms between three and 14 days after they are bitten by the infected mosquito.

How Is WNV Infection Treated?

There is no specific treatment for WNV infection. In cases with milder symptoms, people experience symptoms such as fever and aches that pass on their own, although illness may last weeks to months even in healthy persons. In more severe cases, people usually need to go to the hospital where they can receive supportive treatment including intravenous fluids, help with breathing, and nursing care.

What Should I Do if I Think I Have WNV?

Milder WNV illness improves on its own, and people do not necessarily need to seek medical attention for this infection though they may choose to do so. If you develop symptoms of severe WNV illness, such as unusually severe headaches or confusion, seek medical attention immediately. Severe WNV illness usually requires hospitalization. Pregnant women and nursing mothers are encouraged to talk to their doctor if they develop symptoms that could be WNV.

What is the Risk of Getting Sick from WNV?

- People Over 50 at Higher Risk to Get Severe Illness People over the age of 50 are more likely to develop serious symptoms of WNV if they do get sick and should take special care to avoid mosquito bites.
- Being Outside Means You're at Risk The more time you're outdoors, the more time you could be bitten by an infected mosquito. Pay attention to avoiding mosquito bites if you spend a lot of time outside, either working or playing.
- Risk Through Medical Procedures is Very Low All donated blood is checked for WNV before being used. The risk of getting WNV through blood transfusions and organ transplants is very small, and should not prevent people who need surgery from having it. If you have concerns, talk to your doctor.
- Pregnancy and Nursing do not Increase Risk of Becoming Infected with WNV The risk that WNV may present to a fetus or an infant infected through breastmilk is still being evaluated. Talk with your care provider if you have concerns.

What is the CDC Doing About WNV?

CDC is working with state and local health departments, the Food and Drug Administration and other government agencies, as well as private industry, to prepare for and prevent new cases of WNV. Some things CDC is doing include:

- Coordinating a nationwide electronic database where states share information about WNV.
- Helping states develop and carry out improved mosquito prevention and control programs.
- Developing better, faster tests to detect and diagnose WNV.
- Creating new education tools and programs for the media, the public, and health professionals.
- Opening new testing laboratories for WNV.
- Working with partners to develop vaccines.

What Else Should I Know?

If you find a dead bird don't handle the body with your bare hands. Contact the Health Department at (708) 343-4000, for instructions on reporting and disposing of the body. They may tell you to dispose of the bird after they log your report.







Garage Sale Notice

The rules on garage sales held in the village of Melrose Park are as follows:

Garage sales will be held on the third weekend only during the months of May, June, July, August and September. Sales are to be conducted on Thursday, Friday and Saturday of the designated weekends. No sales are allowed on Sundays.

The remaining dates for 2018 are Sept. 20-22.

Garage sales shall be conducted only during the hours of 9 a.m.-5 p.m.

No permit is needed for garage sales, however the following rules must be followed:

- No garage sales may be conducted in apartment buildings.
- No garage sales in the frontyard, i.e. on the grass.
- All garage sales to be conducted in backyard, garage or driveway.
- All sale items to be displayed on tables not on the ground.
 - No sale items shall be located and no sale activity shall be conducted in the frontyard area on the premises of any public sidewalk, parkway area or other public property.
 - No sale signs, handbills or other advertising material shall be located or posted upon public parkway or on public property, signs, poles or light poles within the village of Melrose Park.
 - Signs advertising the sales shall not exceed 3-by-5 feet and may be located only in the frontyard (private property) of the address having the garage sale and must be removed immediately after the sale.
 - The sale will be conducted without the use of outdoor loud speakers, amplification equipment or illuminated advertising devices.

Any person violating these rules shall be subject to a fine not to exceed \$500. A copy of the garage sale rules is available at the Village Hall.



Fresenius Kabi Celebrates Melrose Park Expansion Project Milestone

A crane will lift the steel beam — adorned with the signatures of individuals involved in the construction project — into place. In the traditional spirit of topping-off, an American flag and a small tree were perched atop the beam.

Fresenius Kabi is making great progress on the 10-year, \$250-million expansion project at the company's production center in Melrose Park, III. Recently, more than 100 team members and distinguished guests participated in a topping-off ceremony celebrating the completion of the vertical structural framework for the

Melrose Park expansion. During this activity, attendees signed the final beam to complete the vertical structure.

"The topping-off ceremony marks a major milestone, the symbolic completion of the structural phase of the building, which remains on schedule to be finished in 2019," said Jean Allaume, senior director, Melrose Park Expansion Project. "Every

time I walk by the site, I am very impressed by all the work that has been completed. We could not be where we are today without the great work and daily effort by the project team."

"A little more than eight months after building construction began, more than 3,300 tons of structural steel have been erected and we are on schedule to have the building enclosed by fall," said Jeff Masters, vice president and LEED AP, Gilbane Building Company, the construction partner for the expansion.

While the project is scheduled to be fully complete in 2026, it is being implemented in phases. The ribbon cutting for the new campus is expected to happen in 2019 when the building is "ready for use." Production on the first lines will begin as early as 2020.

Triton Faculty Member Wins National Pasta Contest; Will Compete in Italy for World Title

From creating dishes inspired by fine art to preparing a new generation of chefs and restaurateurs – Triton College Culinary

Department faculty member Carolina Diaz loves to share her passion for cooking, especially pasta.

Her skills and passion helped earn her the title of the 2018 Barilla Pasta U.S. Master of Pasta, as she beat out top chefs from across the country during the World Pasta Masters U.S. competition in Chicago this spring. Next, she'll take the show on the road as she prepares to compete against chefs from around the world for the international title this October in Milan, Italy.

Diaz, with the assistance of fellow Culinary Department faculty member Manny Uribe, wowed judges in the U.S. competition with her winning pasta dish, which translates from Italian to 'The Tuna Hideout.'

"I was very surprised, I was in shock," Diaz said. "We were up against some very good chefs."

Diaz, who is originally from Northlake, attended Triton College as a student with plans to major in psychology, before changing course to pursue a career in the culinary and hospitality industry. In addition to serving as a faculty member of Triton's Jerome J. Drosos School of Culinary Arts, she is also the head chef at Terzo Piano Restaurant, located inside of the Art Institute of Chicago. There, the self-described pasta specialist delights guests with Mediterranean cuisine, some of which is inspired by exhibits on display at the museum.

"I started making dumplings, from there I transitioned to pasta and it turned into a passion. Once I figured out I could make the dough myself, I fell in love with it. I enjoy making shapes with my fingers, it's therapeutic," she said.

Diaz and Uribe have already begun strategizing for the competition in Italy. The three-phase contest will include a re-creation of their winning dish, followed by a 'mystery basket' dish and finally a traditional pasta with tomato sauce dish.

"We're practicing the first dish because we have to nail it so that we make it to round two," said Diaz.

This fall, she will teach Food Prep Essentials, Italian Cooking and Butchery courses to students enrolled in Triton's renowned Culinary Program.

"We take a hands-on approach and take time to individually teach each student. That's what students crave and I believe that is the best way to help students succeed in their careers," she said.

Triton Receives \$260K AmeriCorps Grant to Bolster Student Tutoring and Mentoring Efforts

The Federal Grant Provides for 24 Half-time AmeriCorps Service Members for the Upcoming School Year

Triton College will significantly increase efforts to help students stay in school and complete their degree thanks to a nearly \$260,000 grant to support the AmeriCorps State Program. The grant, which consists of federal and local match funds, is distributed by the Illinois Department of Public Health's Serve Illinois Commission on Volunteerism and Community Service.

The grant funds will support 24 half-time AmeriCorps Service Members at Triton College throughout the upcoming school year, which will focus primarily on supporting student retention efforts through tutoring and mentoring. AmeriCorps State Program Service Members will receive a stipend along with an additional educational benefit upon completion of their service hours. The educational benefit can be used for education-related expenses including tuition and student loans.

"This is an exciting opportunity for Triton College to expand on strategic plan items that we have not otherwise had the resources or the manpower to expand," said Dr. Deborah Baness King, Triton College dean of Academic Success, the grant's principal investigator.

AmeriCorps State Service Members will complete over 900 hours of service throughout the school year, supporting Triton College student service and mentoring programs including TRIUMPH (Triton Undergraduate Men Pursuing Higher Education), SURGE (Sisterhood of Undergraduate Representing Great Excellence) and TRIO Student Support Services. AmeriCorps State Service Members will also support community partnerships between Triton College and the Oak Park Library as well as West 40 Intermediate Service Center. The grant will allow Triton to implement proven mentoring intervention strategies that will support student success through coaching and individual attention.

"The Triton College AmeriCorps State Program will provide the human capital necessary to implement a comprehensive structure of support for our students that increases individualized services and connects students with a mentor/coach." said Dr. Deborah Baness King.

In total, Serve Illinois distributed more than \$35 million in federal grants to fund 46 AmeriCorps service programs throughout the state. Triton is one of only four Illinois community colleges to be awarded a grant.

"This is the largest AmeriCorps investment Illinois has ever seen in the history of the program," said Serve Illinois Executive Director Scott McFarland. "Last year, AmeriCorps Illinois served nearly 400,000 Illinoisans, including more than 209,000 disadvantaged youth and nearly 40,000 veterans, active military and military family members.







Amazing Arachnids Runs Through Sept. 3 at Brookfield Zoo

Guests visiting Brookfield Zoo will have an aMAZEing time weaving their way through a new temporary exhibit – Amazing Arachnids. The interactive and engaging experience, continuing through Sept. 3, features two components: Art and Science of Arachnids and Mission Safari Maze.

Throughout the exhibit's palette of bright and inviting colors, Art and Science of Arachnids invites zoogoers to discover the marvels of eight-legged critters featured in three themed areas that highlight their unique characteristics and significance in several genres. The art-themed portion of the exhibit illustrates the importance of arachnids in music, literature, and film. The culture-themed space focuses on arachnid conservation, folklore and mythology.





The final section explores arachnids in relation to science and medicine. In addition, 100 live arachnids, including the tiger rump tarantula, emperor scorpion, the alien-looking tailless whip scorpion, the beautiful peacock tarantula, burgundy goliath birdeater, and goliath pinkfoot tarantula are displayed amongst the three sections, making it the largest public collection of arachnids in North America.

A variety of hands-on interactivities and opportunities for guests of all ages enhance the experience. These fun and entertaining components include weaving a web, assembling puzzle pieces to create a unique spider, learning an Italian folk dance

called the Tarantella and controlling the movements of a tarantula at the Arachnid Mobility station that features two computer monitors. In the Arachnid Art Gallery, zoogoers can view 10 beautiful arachnid images by world-renowned German arachnid photographer Julian Kamzol.

Additionally, animal care staff will bring the nuances of the species to life with amazing facts and lively tales during spontaneous Zoo Chats. Guests will not only get up-close views of various arachnids, they will also learn what arachnids eat, how they survive in the wild, what are their natural predators, and how – as individuals and families – they can help play a vital part in preserving arachnids and their habitats.

Another component of Amazing Arachnids - Mission Safari Maze - is a maze experience that blends education along with physical activity, making it a unique learning adventure for guests of all ages. The interactive attraction connects guests to the stories and strengths of 16 species of animals that can all be seen at Brookfield Zoo. Animals include the bison, Amur tiger, Andean condor, bald eagle, black rhinoceros, black widow spider, Blanding's turtle, Bornean orangutan, emperor scorpion, green-winged macaw, Indian peafowl, Orinoco crocodile, peacock tarantula, red knee tarantula, reticulated giraffe, and white-bellied pangolin.
