
Dear Neighbors,

After review, a Police

contact the requestor to notify them of approval or disapproval. The form can only be
used for three days per
month and is not valid until a
supervisor signs off on it.

If approved, the permission
will not allow the violation of
village ordinances or parking
laws. All violators will be ticketed.



#### Always Stepping Up ...

### Village of Melrose Park/School District 89 Hold Active Threat Drill, Operational Deployment Plan

On Thursday, Aug. 4, the Melrose Park Police, Fire and Homeland Security – Public Safety departments partnered with representatives from Norcomm, and the Maywood and Broadview Police and Fire departments to conduct an active threat drill at Stevenson Middle School along with School District 89 personnel.

Active shooter incidents are very unpredictable and evolve quickly. The village enhanced its preparedness through a unified response plan including all stakeholders providing resources to help prepare for and respond to an active shooter incident.

The drill is important for law enforcement to practice neutralizing a shooter at a specific facility and for EMS personnel to know how and where to triage victims. The drill is also critical to train the occupants of the building to know how to respond, to make sure the students, teachers and administrators have knowledge of active shooter protocols, that there is a plan for reunification with parents and family members, and the establishment of a joint public information center.

It's equally important to be able to react quickly as situations change. During the drill, the Police, Fire and Homeland Security – Public Safety departments practiced maintaining a unified, coordinated organizational structure; establishing a unified command to handle communications, planning, operations, pre-position of resources, monitoring of threats and hazards; and ensuring



planning, operations, pre-position of resources, monitoring of threats and hazards; and ensuring a prompt and coordinated response to any emergency.

#### MP Deputy Police Chief Greco, MP HSPS Chief Schwartz Receive Lyons Police Department Commendation

On Thursday, Aug. 26, 2021, the Lyons Public Works Department expressed concern regarding the well-being of the occupants of residence within their village. Lyons police officers made a well-being check and quickly learned that all was not well. Quickly noting that two brothers were living in filth and squalor, and the other occupants of the house hadn't been seen in years. Lyons' personnel questioned the brothers and learned that their mother and sister had been deceased for many years. It was also learned that the brothers buried the two women in the backyard.

Assistance was requested from the West Suburban Task Force (WESTAF), which was immediately provided. Melrose Park Deputy Police Chief Anthony Greco, MP Homeland Security – Public Safety Chief Phil Schwartz, members of the task force and supporting professionals performed an archeological dig and recovery subsequently exhuming the remains of the mother and sister, in addition to any evidence that may have been left.

Because of the condition of the house and the possibility of useful evidence being there, the task force cleared the structure.

During the dig and recovery, the task force required many intense hours of work in hot summer conditions while wearing full protective gear and respirators.

The village of Lyons, the Lyons administration and the Lyons Police Department took great pleasure in presenting their Outside Agency Commendation to Deputy Chief Greco and all those involved for their help and hard work, and for a job well done!

The village of Melrose Park congratulates Deputy Chief Greco and Chief Schwartz for this well-deserved recognition.



Republic Services is contracted to pick up your regular, everyday garbage and household items, such as couches, tables, mattresses, box springs, desks and chairs, etc.

Recycling and yard waste is collected on Tuesdays from April through November and must be placed in a 33-gallon refuse can or biodegradable paper bags. Plastic bags will not be accepted.

All items are to be put out the night before or morning of scheduled garbage pickup.

Winston Park Area and West Melrose – Once garbage has been picked up, garbage container is to be removed from curb line and placed back on resident's property.



## From the Desk of Chief Phil Schwartz Melrose Park Departments of Homeland Security — Public Safety

#### **What You Need to Know About Monkeypox**

Initial outbreaks of reported monkeypox (MPV) cases in May of 2022 were seen in Europe and first reported case in the United State (Massachusetts) were identified where the infected individual had not traveled to Africa where previous exposed monkeypox outbreaks were identified. Some of the outbreaks have patients who identify as gay, bisexual or other same gender loving men. These outbreaks are currently under investigation and more information is expected in the future. Therefore, health care providers in Illinois should be alert for any suspect cases, even if the patient has not traveled but has an illness suspected to be MPV. These cases should be promptly reported to their local health department. Requests for testing should be made through the local health department.

MPV is rare and does not spread easily between people typically without close contact like skin-to-skin or face-to-face. Data currently shows transmission is higher among people in close sexual networks, however, anyone in close contact like face-to-face (such as prolong hugging, cuddling, kissing) or skin-to-skin (such as prolong body contact) to any infected person may get the infection.

#### **About Monkeypox (MPV)**

Monkeypox or MPV as it's called in the latest development of this rare disease caused by infection with the monkeypox virus. Monkeypox virus belongs to the orthopoxvirus genus in the family Poxviridae. Monkeypox is not related to chickenpox.

First discovered in monkeys with pox-like disease in 1958. Despite being named "monkeypox", the source of the disease remains unknown. However, African rodents and non-human primates (like monkeys) may harbor the virus and infect people.

The first known human case of monkeypox was identified in 1970. Monkeypox can be found in animals (African rodents, monkeys, and other primates) and usually encountered in villages in west and central Africa. Historically, persons in Illinois could become infected by traveling to west and central Africa and being exposed to people or animals with the disease. One human outbreak in the U.S. in 2003 occurred when African rodents came in contact with pet prairie dogs at an Illinois animal vendor. Some persons in contact with the infected prairie dogs developed monkeypox, including 10 Illinois residents.

#### Signs and Symptoms

Monkeypox (MPV) is in the orthopox virus family, which includes cowpox and smallpox. Smallpox is no longer circulating in the world and was declared eradicated by the World Health Organization in 1980. Symptoms of monkeypox are milder than the symptoms of smallpox. The main difference between smallpox and monkeypox is that monkeypox causes lymph nodes to swell, while smallpox does not. The incubation period for monkeypox is usually seven to 14 days, but can range from five to 21 days.

MPV illness begins with fever, headache, muscle aches, backache, swollen lymph nodes, chills and exhaustion.

Within one to three days (sometimes longer) after the appearance of fever, the patient develops a rash, often beginning on the face and then spreading to other parts of the body or near certain areas like genitals, anus (butt), hands, feet, chest or face. These sores can look like pimples and may be painful or itchy. They can be inside the body, including mouth, anus or vagina. Note that a person is infectious the moment any of the above signs and symptoms start to appear.

The illness typically lasts for two to four weeks.

#### **How it Spreads**

Monkeypox (MPV) may spread in different ways. The virus may spread from close contact like skin-to-skin or face-to-face through:

- Direct contact with infected skin rash, lesions, scabs or body fluids.
- Respiratory droplets during extended face-to-face contact or during intimate physical contact, such as kissing, cuddling or sex.
- Contact with contaminated materials or objects (like clothing, towels or linens) previously touched by infectious rash or body fluids.
- Pregnant people may spread the virus to their fetus through the placenta.

Individuals are infectious as soon as signs and symptoms appear.

People may get MPV from infected animals, either by being scratched or bitten by the infected animal or by preparing or eating meat or using products from an infected animal.

#### Garage Sale Notice

## Garage Sales are Back ... It's Time to Sell All Those Treasures

The rules on garage sales held in the village of Melrose Park are as follows:

Garage sales will be held on the third weekend only during the months of May, June,

July, August and September. Sales are to be conducted on Thursday, Friday and Saturday of the designated weekends. No sales are allowed on Sundays.

The remaining dates for 2022 are Aug. 18-20 and Sept. 15-17.

Garage sales shall be conducted only during the hours of 9 a.m.-5 p.m.

No permit is needed for garage sales, however the following rules must be followed:

- No garage sales may be conducted in apartment buildings.
- No garage sales in the frontyard, i.e., on the grass.
- All garage sales to be conducted in backyard, garage or on driveway.
- All sale items to be displayed on tables, not on the ground.
- No sale items shall be located and no sale activity shall be conducted in the frontyard area, on the premises of any public sidewalk, parkway area or other public property.
- No sale signs, handbills or other advertising material shall be located or posted upon public parkway or on public property, signs, poles or light poles within the village of Melrose Park.
- Signs advertising the sales shall not exceed 3-by-5 feet and may be located only in the frontyard (private property) of the address having the garage sale, and must be removed immediately after the sale.
- The sale will be conducted without the use of outdoor loud speakers, amplification equipment or illuminated advertising devices.

Any person violating these rules shall be subject to a fine not to exceed \$500. A copy of garage sale rules is available at www.melrosepark.org.

#### Village Vehicle Stickers Expired Dec. 31, 2021. New Stickers Can be Purchased at the Village Hall.

Sticker Fee for Passenger Vehicles is \$40 for Two Years (2022-2023).

Truck Fees Vary Based on the Type of Class/Plate and Are Good for One Year Only (2022).

Seniors Over 65 Years of Age are Free.

One free two-year sticker for a passenger vehicle or one free one-year sticker for a B-Truck vehicle registered to a person over 65 years in age. Limit one free sticker per household. If there is a second passenger or B-Truck vehicle registered to a senior in the household, a second senior sticker will be sold for half price (\$15).

Acceptable proof for a senior sticker is a valid driver's license or state ID card.

#### **Vehicle Sticker Fee Details**

## Ophthalmic Tech Program Can be Completed in Five Semesters

Triton College is offering ophthalmic technology, a growing, in-demand field, on its campus. Since the program is only offered at very few community colleges in Illinois, Triton is a desirable institution for the field.

Lisa Maas, Triton's Ophthalmic Technician Program chair, explained that an ophthalmic technician is a health career professional that works alongside an ophthalmologist (an eye doctor/surgeon), who specializes in eye disease and pathology.

"Technicians provide an explanation to the patients regarding their diagnosis, recommended treatment and can also assist in surgery," she said.

Other responsibilities include gathering patient information and history, performing an initial eye exam, and any other required diagnostic tests that will assist the physician with a diagnosis and treatment plan. Maas feels the field is great for those who are outgoing, empathetic and have great communication skills.

At Triton, there are no prerequisite courses for the 60-credit-hour program. The program can be completed in five semesters, which is just under two years. Some courses include optics, ocular anatomy, ophthalmic procedures, ocular disease and three clinical practicum courses.

Unlike other health fields, there aren't any mandatory certification board exams required to enter the workforce and it is not as competitive as other health fields.

Other advantages include working in a "clean" medicine field where students can assist patients with eye disease and pathology in hospitals, universities or private practice. Those who enter the field will have normal hours that provide a consistent schedule with no on-call hours.

The U.S. Bureau of Labor Statistics lists the Chicago metropolitan area in the Top Metropolitan Areas with Highest Level of Employment of Ophthalmic Technicians. The field is expected to grow 8 percent from now through 2029.

Most ophthalmic technicians typically make \$19-\$21 per hour after graduation, but since the demand is so high, many are making more than \$21 per hour.

"Triton's lab is one of the best in the country and our faculty work in the industry as technicians," said Maas, noting that Triton's program has a good reputation for producing high-trained technicians. "Students work with hands-on training in the lab as well as clinical rotations with area oph-thalmic practices."


The Friday night dinner was a perfect occasion to fraternize and enjoy a good meal with family and friends.

# Cook County Awards Funding to Four 16th District Public Schools for Renewable Energy Education Initiative

Under Cook County's Solar Schools Grant Program, the Cook County Department of Environment and Sustainability awarded grant funding to 24 public schools, four within the 16th District, to support the construction of small photovoltaic (PV) systems used to educate students first-hand how sunlight is converted into electricity

The county's program provides supplemental funding to grantees of the Illinois Clean Energy Community Foundation's (ICECF) K-12 Solar Schools Program, which assists with the installation of 1kW PV systems throughout Illinois institutions serving grades K-12. Each school is reimbursed a maximum of \$5,000 by the county upon installation of the system.

"Cook County is grateful to the Illinois Clean Energy Community Foundation for their partnership on this important initiative," said Cook County Board President Toni Preckwinkle. "This program enables our young people to better understand the science behind renewable energy and to see that a career in renewable energy might be in their future."

Grantees commit to incorporating solar and renewable energy into their STEM curriculum and to host "Solarbrations" that celebrate the PV system within their school community.

"Providing public schools the resources they need enables students to not only have access to a top-tier educational experience, but also allows students to follow their passions and find what they want to do with their lives," said 16th District Cook County Commissioner Frank J. Aguilar. "I am proud that four 16th District schools were chosen for this award, and am excited to see its impact on students and faculty alike in working to protect this world, today and tomorrow."

# Cook County's Law Library Offers Free Computer Access for Residents to Attend Virtual Court Appearances

**New Initiative Supports Residents Who Lack Internet Access** 

Residents who don't have internet access can now attend virtual court appearances from the Cook County Law Library. The library is offering residents free computer access to attend virtual court appearances. This initiative is available for residents who lack internet access or who do not want to attend hearings from their home.

"Ensuring all residents have access to technology creates a more equitable Cook County," said Cook County Board President Toni Preckwinkle. "In response to the pandemic, many services are now offered virtually and not everyone has access to the internet or a computer. This program removes barriers and streamlines computer access for free."

The Law Library was awarded funding from the Illinois State Library for new computers, software and equipment. Right now, the library can accommodate two remote hearings at a time with capacity increasing to five simultaneous remote hearings in the coming weeks.

Walk-ins are welcome as equipment is first-come, first-served. Residents interested in using this service should bring whatever paperwork is needed for their court appearance.

"I applaud this initiative and hope that it will make this process less stressful for residents, while also allowing for a more efficient court process to take place," said 16th District Cook County Commissioner Frank J. Aguilar. "We must always look at where the need is, where residents need help, and then do all we can to address that need in accessible and equitable ways."

# Cook County Board of Commissioners Approves Gun Violence Reduction Grants, Assault Weapons Ban

On Thursday, July 28, the Cook County Board of Commissioners approved a series of measures for reducing gun violence. Using funds from the

American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA), Cook County awarded nearly \$75 million in grants to directly support violence prevention programs over the next three years.

"This \$75 million initiative, led by our Justice Advisory Council, is more than symbolic and signals a beacon of hope," said President Preckwinkle. "It represents our commitment to investing in communities that continue to experience the ramifications of racism and historic disinvestment."

The 34 grants were awarded to individual organizations and coalitions serving city neighborhoods and suburban municipalities that the ongoing gun violence epidemic has impacted most.

"This much needed investment into our communities is critical to bringing safety back to our streets. This money is not just thrown at a problem, but carefully planned to address root causes of violence and systemic failures," said Cook County Commissioner Frank J. Aguilar. "I am proud to be a yes vote on both of these measures and will stay committed to keeping families safe by investing in our communities."



Commissioners also approved a resolution banning the sale, possession and use of assault weapons or large-capacity magazines in Cook County. This resolution is a continuation of Cook County's 1996 Blair Holt Assault Weapons Ban, which was upheld in 2020 by the U.S. Supreme Court.

### **U.S. News & World Report** Recognizes Loyola Medicine Hospitals

Loyola Medicine hospitals have been recognized by *U.S. News & World Report* in the magazine's 2022-2023 Best Hospitals rankings. Once again, Loyola University Medical Center (LUMC) has been ranked among the top 10 hospitals in the state of Illinois, as it has been since *U.S. News* hospital rankings began in 2013. This year, LUMC has been ranked sixth in the state. In addition, LUMC has two nationally ranked specialties and is recognized as "high performing" in five specialties and eleven conditions and procedures.

Loyola is ranked as one of the best hospitals in the country in two specialty categories Gastroenterology & GI Surgery (45th) and Ear, Nose & Throat (48th). *U.S News* also recognized five Loyola specialties as high performing: Cardiology & Heart Surgery, Geriatrics, Neurology & Neurosurgery, Orthopaedics, and Pulmonary & Lung Surgery. To achieve a national ranking, a hospital must be ranked among the nation's top 50 hospitals in a given specialty. A high-performing specialty is among the top 10 percent in the nation.

All three Loyola Medicine hospitals were rated high performing in a variety of adult procedure and condition categories. Loyola University Medical Center was rated high performing in 11 adult procedure and condition categories: aortic valve surgery, chronic obstructive pulmonary disease (COPD), colon cancer surgery, diabetes, heart attack, heart bypass surgery, heart failure, kidney failure, lung cancer surgery, pneumonia and stroke. Gottlieb Memorial Hospital was also rated high performing in COPD, while MacNeal Hospital was rated high performing in COPD and Stroke. Hospitals named high performing in these areas performed significantly better than the national average.

"We are proud to see Loyola recognized once again by *U.S. News & World Report* as one of the top hospitals in Illinois. 

# Thirty-three Diverse Businesses Graduate ComEd Energy Efficiency Service Provider Incubator

Since 2019, 66 Graduates Have Helped
139 Northern Illinois Residents and Businesses Save Money and Energy

To expand energy efficiency while helping diverse businesses across northern Illinois grow, ComEd announced the graduation of 33 minority-owned, woman-owned, veteran-owned and other contractor businesses from the ComEd Energy Efficiency Service Provider (EESP) Incubator Program. ComEd marked the occasion with a graduation ceremony in Oak Brook, Ill.

The EESP Incubator Program offers participants education and training on ComEd's energy efficiency portfolio offerings; provides one-on-one assistance with certification applications, business growth plans and building relationships with project financing lenders; and identifies, addresses and resolves barriers to building a successful business in the energy efficiency field. Participants will also have the opportunity to be matched with an experienced mentor for additional peer-to-peer support.



"For ComEd, powering lives is more than delivering electricity to our customers," said Gil C. Quiniones, CEO of ComEd. "It's about supporting the region's workforce and economy through utility-driven, clean-energy innovation and opportunities. The success of our customers and communities will always be at the center of everything we do here at ComEd."

ComEd created the EESP Incubator Program in 2019 to focus on recruiting diverse contractor businesses and to support the development of all interested contractors. After graduation, contractors are eligible to join the EESP network and, once accepted, provide ComEd Energy Efficiency Program incentives to customers and grow their businesses through the successful completion of energy efficiency projects.

### **One Participant's Story**

To address the barriers often faced by diverse contractor businesses, ComEd saw an opportunity to develop programs to support these local businesses, especially those whose employees are trained as lighting, HVAC or general contractors.

Ramon Hayes is a 2019 Incubator Program alumnus and owner of South Holland, Ill.-based Eco-Energy Solutions, a service-disabled, veteran-owned business. Prior to participating in the program, Hayes relied on a small client base and single contract to keep his business doors open. The Incubator team, through one-on-one sessions, assisted Hayes in developing a business growth plan and provided opportunities to enhance his networking abilities.

"The Incubator Program was really instrumental in allowing me networking opportunities and in putting me in front of major players in the energy-efficiency space," said Hayes. "It's actually really simple. There is no way I would be doing the volume of business that I am doing, had I not gone through the Incubator Program."

Hayes now mentors current Incubator cohort members in energy efficiency project best practices.

Eco-Energy Solutions is one of 66 contractor businesses that have participated in ComEd's EESP Incubator. Of those participants, 51 have joined the EESP Network and, to date, have submitted 139 energy efficiency projects to ComEd. Many of those projects are located in communities of need which aligns with ComEd's vision for a clean energy future for all communities it serves, but especially for those most vulnerable to the impacts of climate change.

Over the years, the ComEd Energy Efficiency Program has increasingly helped customers of all kinds reduce their energy bills and consumption, which also helps reduce dependence on fossil fuels. Since its inception in 2008, the ComEd Energy Efficiency Program has provided impactful contributions toward Illinois' clean energy future. Specifically, the ComEd Energy Efficiency Program has:

# ComEd Announces 681 Residents Completed Clean Energy Job Training in 2021

# ComEd Partnership with Local Workforce Agencies has Helped Train Nearly 2,400 Residents Since 2017, Supporting Equitable Clean Energy Expansion in Illinois

In July, ComEd announced that more than 681 Illinois residents completed clean energy training programs in 2021 to prepare them for jobs in the growing fields of solar and renewable energy. Last year's program saw continued gains, with an overall 89 percent graduation rate and 83 percent job placement rate, with participation from diverse residents across the state of Illinois. ComEd reported the training outcomes to the Illinois Commerce Commission on July 1, as part of the Future Energy Jobs Act (FEJA).

Since launching the training program with 11 local agencies in 2017, ComEd has supported 2,393 participants in completing industry-aligned jobs training, including a more than 80 percent job placement during the life of the program. The year-over-year success of the FEJA training programs are helping provide talent needed for clean energy expansion in Illinois, which calls for growth of new renewable energy technologies, including solar.

"ComEd is working to prepare our communities for the transition to a clean energy economy, which will bring new investment, air quality improvements and jobs to our communities," said Gil C. Quiniones, CEO of ComEd. "Access to comprehensive training and education programs is essential for creating a talent pipeline to meet current demand and to expand solar and new clean energy technologies for the future. This will help ensure that more residents, who reflect the diversity of our communities, benefit from family-sustaining jobs created by clean energy growth right here in Illinois."

Agency partners reported strong participation outcomes from the 2021 program, including 1,540 certifications received and 421 job placements following graduation. The program continued to demonstrate high levels of diverse participation, including 60 percent minority; 53 percent from environmental justice communities; 18 percent women; and 17 percent returning citizens. Last year's participants represent 31 counties in Illinois.

Trainees graduated from one of three programs: the Solar Training Pipeline, the Craft Apprenticeship led by the International Brotherhood of Electrical Workers (IBEW) Renewable Energy Fund, or the Multicultural Job Training Program. To help close the gap in workforce equity, all programs prioritize recruitment and training efforts for populations which are either at-risk or underrepresented in the industry. Graduates received training to prepare for roles in the energy industry, including solar installer, journeyman and laborer.

The Solar Training Pipeline Program prepares job seekers for roles in the solar industry and prepares contractors to bid on solar projects. Training includes a solar bootcamp and is implemented by Elevate Energy, Illinois Central College, OAI, Inc. and the Safer Foundation. The 2021 Solar Training Pipeline Program had 73 trainees, 85 percent of them minority residents, and saw an 89 percent graduation rate.

The Craft Apprenticeship Training Program provides a pathway to roles in electric industry trades, introduction to solar and "train-the-trainer" programs delivered by IBEW locals at high schools across Illinois. The 2021 program featured an expansion of training programs to new CPS high schools, including Dunbar and Simeon. All 410 trainees in the IBEW program graduated and 99 percent secured employment.

"One of the ways the Chicago Urban League works to advance economic equity is by preparing people from underserved communities for in-demand jobs. Over the past few years, we've had dozens of trainees complete our solar panel installation training and go on to successful careers that have changed not only their lives and the lives of their families, but their outlook on the future," said Karen Freeman-Wilson, president and CEO of the Chicago Urban League. "ComEd has been an essential partner in our work and we look forward to continuing to work together to prepare Black Chicagoans to participate in the fast-growing renewable energy sector."

The Multicultural Training Program upskills trainees from diverse and underserved communities with training delivered by the Chicago Urban League, National Latino Education Institute (NLEI), ASPIRA of Illinois and Austin Peoples Action Center. The program is also supported by multicultural industry organizations, including the Chatham Business Association and the Hispanic American Construction Industry Association (HACIA). There were 220 participants in the Multicultural Training Program in 2021, with a 72 percent graduation rate.

"HACIA is committed to creating pathways of opportunity for diverse businesses and underrepresented groups in the emerging clean energy sector," said Jacqueline Gomez, executive director of HACIA. "Our cohort-based training, funding by FEJA and in partnership with ComEd, has allowed us to do just that, positioning small and diverse businesses to grow and take on new projects. We hope to continue this important work in the near future."

The FEJA training programs are administered with a \$30 million investment by ComEd. To date, \$10 million has been invested in training programs in 2017-2021 and another \$20 million is set for release by the Illinois Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity (DCEO), which will be administering FEJA training grants in future cycles.

To support the steady growth of a diverse talent pipeline, ComEd is invested in a wide array of training, education and job readiness programs that help residents of all ages and backgrounds prepare for a future in energy. These programs include the award-winning CONSTRUCT Infrastructure Academy, Chicago Builds, a CPS high school trades program, and various training programs offered in collaboration with local education institutions. Overall, ComEd's workforce training programs in 2021 reached over 1,400 residents.

# 2-Month-Old South American Tapir Calf Now Outdoors

Guests visiting Brookfield Zoo can now see a South American tapir calf, who turned 2 months old recently, in his outdoor habitat, located on the north side of Pachyderm House. While getting acclimated to his new surroundings, he and his mother Sorghum (SOAR-gum) also will have access to their indoor space.

One particular characteristic that zoogoers will notice are the calf's white stripes that serve as an excellent camouflage. Baby tapirs are born with the stripes, which will begin to fade in a few months, and are completely gone by 6 months of age. Currently, the male calf weighs approximately 70 pounds. He will reach full size at about 18 months of age and could weigh as much as 500 pounds.

# Pygmy Hippopotamus Arrives at Brookfield Zoo

Brookfield Zoo recently welcomed Banana – a female pygmy hippopotamus who will be turning 3 years old on Aug. 27. As she continues to get acclimated to her new home, guests can see her either inside at the zoo's Pachyderm House or in her outdoor habitat on the building's west side.

The zoo has a long history of including the species in its animal collection dating back to when the zoo first opened in 1934. Its most recent pygmy hippo, Adelle, was humanely euthanized in June 2021 due to problems associated with her advanced age – she was a remarkable 44 years old.

Much smaller and rarer than the common river hippopotamus, the pygmy hippo weighs between 350 and 600 pounds, and can reach a body length of up to about 5.75 feet. Although adapted for spending time in the water, it is less aquatic than its larger relative. Hippos secrete a white or pinkish substance called "blood sweat" from their pores that provides a protective coat like sunscreen on their skin.

The pygmy hippo, whose closest living relative is the whale, is listed as endangered on the IUCN's (International Union for Conservation of Nature and Natural Resources) Red List of Threatened Species

(International Union for Conservation of Nature and Natural Resources) Red List of Threatened Species. Found in the interior forests of West Africa's Ivory Coast, Guinea, Liberia and Sierra Leone, the population is declining mainly due to deforestation of its habitat as well as an increase in development associated with mining. In addition, due to the pygmy hippo's range becoming more fragmented, hunters are posing an additional threat to the remaining population, which is estimated to be between 2,000 to 3,000 individuals.
